### **Public Works Committee Meeting – 2/4/20**

### **Public Works Department Report – Director David Gray**

AMI (Automated Metering Infrastructure)

- Frequently Asked Questions example form submitted
- Notice about new system has been put in newspaper, on website, and on social media
- Regarding opting out of program. Atty Witherington does not feel we can give the option to opt out. We cannot maintain 2 different systems if someone opts to keep the old meters, and legally the new equipment is our responsibility.
- Code 18-115 was referenced by Atty Witherington
- Discussed sending Frequently Asked Questions to public, social media, and newspaper (click here to view the Frequently Asked Questions).
- Alderman Morris has spoken to several Aldermen in other municipalities and are they happy with their automated systems.
- Director Gray stated that meter readers will not lose their jobs but will be placed in other positions that are open within Public Works
- Alderwoman Bommer stated one benefit of the system is that we will know immediately if there is a water leak or a problem. This will be beneficial to our entire community.

### Hwy 51 Paving Update

- Preconstruction Conference was on 1/30
- Project will begin soon. Signage will start going up the last week of February, concrete work will start
  on 3/2 (ADA Standard), paving to begin first week of April. Construction times will be 8 p.m.-6 a.m.
  for less traffic disruption.

Update on Hwy 51 speed limit change Wynn St. to south city limit. New speed limit signs will go up soon.

### Gasifier

- Meeting scheduled for 2/11
- Submission for last permit has been made
- We are ready to go as soon as it is permitted

### Conducting Audit of Residential Rollouts (trash cans)

- This will determine how many rollouts each resident has and if they are being billed properly
- Need to make sure residents are paying for every rollout they have
- Commercial dumpsters will have audit after residential audit
- Alderman Wallace inquired about what businesses have rollouts vs. dumpsters
- Alderman Morris discussed some residents' frustration about trash not being collected on assigned day. Explained weight of truck may be too much and must be dumped. Republic will pick up the following day if this happens

Municipal Code Codification – we are about 3 months out
Draft of zoning ordinance was given to Planning Commission today
Motion to accept report, approved

Resident Robert Simonton spoke about flooding on Tuxedo Dr. Inquired about possible ditches being fixed to improve drainage. Some houses are dealing with mold problem because of standing water. Some culverts are stopped up completely.

- Director Gray agreed that there are flooding issues. However, the ditches are on private property.
   Water has to drain to the back of the properties on left side, but past the lots are private properties.
   The ditches need to be cleaned out as there are bags of cans and garbage clogging the ditches. Culvert work can be done, but property owners would have to pay for it. It is a grading issue as much as a draining issue.
- Per Atty Witherington, there are several legal steps we can take if there is garbage in the ditches. We would have to relate it to a public safety concern. We have had multiple discussions about culverts and ditches, and we are limited on what we can do from a city standpoint.
- Director Fisher stated that the area is in a flood plain
- Alderwoman Bommer suggested that property owners and City come together for a solution.
- Mr. Simonton offered to purchase culverts if the City can install them. Submitted pictures of standing water 4 days after a rain.
- Director Gray stated that the ditches on the road are not the problem.
- Alderman Morris asked what we could do on our part.
- Director Gray stated that we can put in culverts, but the problem will not be fixed until the ditches on the private properties are cleaned out.
- Atty Witherington suggested sending letter to property owners explaining that the lack of maintenance on their property is causing drainage problems.
- Per Atty Witherington, we cannot legally go onto someone's property and clean out a ditch.
- Director Fisher suggested we speak with EMA (Emergency Management Agency) Director Tommy Dunavant regarding any FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) money that may come available
- Alderman Wallace asked about logistics of replacing culverts. Replacing culverts would show good faith that the City is taking whatever steps it can.
- Mr. Simonton thought it would be 5-6 culverts
- Alderwoman Bommer suggested Director Gray bring back a report as to what can be done. Also, send letters out immediately to property owners.
- Mr. Simonton and Director Gray were agreeable to Alderwoman Bommer's suggestion
- Motion made, 2<sup>nd</sup>, approved



The Tipton County Museum Veteran of the Month for February 2020 is Renea Antoinette McBride. Renea was born on March 14, 1971, in Brownsville, Tennessee. A few months after graduating from high school in 1989 she travelled to Memphis to enlist in the United States Navy, and attended boot camp in

Orlando, Florida. She began her Navy career as a Boiler Technician, attending training in Great Lakes. In February of 1990 she jumped at the opportunity to become a Cryptologic Technician Operator, and she attended training for this in Pensacola, Florida. In January of 1991 she received orders to go to Panama, and then in August of 1992 she was assigned to BQ2 Air Crew Squadron in Rhoda, Spain. In October of 1994 she was reassigned to Anacostia Naval Station, Maryland, where she worked closely with the Commanding Officer and Executive Officer in the Admin Office. While on her next assignment in Korea, she received the news that her father was ill. When her tour was completed, she made the difficult decision to leave the Navy to return home to care for him. A true patriot, Renea loved being in the Navy and loved travelling the world during her career. She was an active volunteer throughout her career, taking lead logistic roles in the first Million Man March and in other lesser known activities. Sang the National Anthem at Naval retirements and changes of command. During her assignment in Korea she was nominated for Sailor of the Quarter and then on to Sailor of the Year at Suslak Building, Yongsan Compound, Seoul, South Korea. For her service to our country, she was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal (2), National Defense Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Ribbon (2), Good Conduct Medal (2), Navy & Marine Corps Service Ribbon (2), Battle "E" Ribbon, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (2), Overseas Service Medal (2), 45 Cal Pistol Marksman Ribbon, and Flag Letter of Commendation (2).

After returning home to Tennessee, she became a telecommunications contractor and in May of 2007 she accepted a federal job with the IRS, where she still works today. Sadly, her father passed away in 2002; but she is grateful for the time she was able to spend with him. Renea is still very active in the community: she is President of the town of Mason's Planning Commission and Chairman of the Zoning Board. She is a member of Greenleaf Community Church where she is President of the Pastor's Committee and a member of the choir.

Even with her busy schedule, she finds time to pursue her passion - creating natural hand-crafted bath and body products. In 2015 she started her own business, "Just Splurge", where she sells her products at fairs and events in the community. In 2020 she hopes to expand her business by opening her own retail store.

She is proud of her two children: Son Darius McBride attends Middle Tennessee State University where he is studying prelaw, and daughter Liana McBride is an extremely talented artist who is a home schooled 8<sup>th</sup> grader. Renea was nominated for Veteran of the Month by her uncle, John McBride, who was the May 2015 Veteran of the Month.





### **Notice Covington Utilities Customers**

The City of Covington is in the process of installing AMI (Advanced Metering Infrastructure) to replace its aging water and gas meters. Beginning the week of February 10, 2020, Utilities Department employees and contractors will be conducting a site survey at each home and business. The survey is to collect information necessary to replace all water meters as well as install data collection for gas meters. This first phase should take approximately one month. Phase II will begin after all material has been ordered and shipped. Installation will require a very short interruption of service for each customer. We expect this last phase to be completed in twelve to fifteen months. We regret any inconvenience this may cause but it will greatly improve insight into system operation and customer service. As per rules that went into effect on July 1, 2015, the City of Covington is *strictly enforcing* due dates, cutoff dates, and late/reconnect fees for our utility customers. 


