The Public Works Committee met at City Hall on May 5, 2015 at 1:00 p.m. with the following members present: Chairman Alderman Mac McGowan, Alderman William Timberlake, Alderwoman Minnie Bommer, and Mayor Justin Hanson. Also present were Alderman Jere Hadley, Public Works Director Robert Simpson, Code Enforcement/Building Official Lessie Fisher, Alderman Drew Glass, Sailene Wilcox, Pam Harris, David Gwinn, Echo Day, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Chairman Alderman Mac McGowan called meeting to order.

Sailene Wilcox requested the Committee to consider the paving of her streets in her community. The Covington Housing Authority has been working on the utilities and the streets need to be repaired.

Motion was made by Minnie Bommer and seconded by William Timberlake to recommend to the Board that Public Works Director Robert Simpson approach Covington Housing Authority to research the problem at Covington Housing and correct this problem. Motion passed.

Bryan Wolfe presented the Committee with a petition requesting speed bumps be placed on South Tipton Street due to speeding and there are children present on the street (See Attached).

Motion was made by Minnie Bommer and seconded by William Timberlake to recommend to the Board to install speed bumps and children at play signs on South Tipton Street. Motion passed.

Code Enforcement/Building Official Lessie Fisher gave an update on the Building Codes as required by the State of the Tennessee and will bring to the body the amendments that will be needed for approval when they are completed.

Pam Harris requested that second notices be eliminated for a cost savings to the Utility Department which would begin July, 2015 (See Attached). Customers would have a ten day period after their due date to pay their bill before their service is terminated. Also, a request was made to raise the fire hydrant water deposit from \$100.00 to \$\$750.00.

Motion was made by William Timberlake and seconded by Minnie Bommer to recommend to the Board to eliminate the second notice billing beginning July, 2015. Motion passed.

Motion was made by William Timberlake and seconded by Minnie Bommer to recommend to the Board to raise the fire hydrant water meter deposit from \$100.00 to \$750.00 beginning July, 2015. Motion passed.

Public Works Director Robert Simpson reported he was looking at alternative ways into handling the waste collected curbside by city trucks. Also, he was working on a spreadsheet with Lessie Fisher to identify drainage problems and would present at the next public works meeting. The Code Enforcement/Animal Control Report for April, 2015 was submitted for approval (See Attached).

Motion was made by Minnie Bommer and seconded by William Timberlake to recommend to the Board to approve the Code Enforcement/Animal Control Report for April, 2015. Motion passed.

Alderman Mac McGowan gave an update on the Biomass Gasification Plant. A revenue/expense report for April, 2015 showing a deficit for 21,841.03 is attached.

Alderman Drew Glass inquired about the striping of streets. Public Works Director Robert Simpson will research this cost and give an update at the next meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 2:40 p.m.

City Attorney T. D. Forrester gave an update on the pending judgment on the Flat Iron/Cottonwood Case against the City stating the case has been dismissed as this time. Attorney Rachel Gangaware gave an update on the conference call between the PHG Energy Attorney and the City Attorney. A more detailed proposal will be presented at the next Board Meeting.
