The Board of Mayor and Aldermen met at City of Covington on August 9, 2022 at 5:31 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Justin Hanson, Aldermen: Jeff Morris, C H Sullivan, Danny Wallace, Chris Richardson, John Edwards, and Johnetta Yarbrough. Also, present were Police Chief Donna Turner, Building Official Lessie Fisher, Parks and Recreation Director Molly Glass, Personnel Director Eboni Eaton, Public Works Director David Gray, Fire Chief Richard Griggs, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Justin Hanson.

Invocation was given by Alderman Jeff Morris.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Alderman Danny Wallace.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Morris that the Minutes of the Preceding Meeting be approved as distributed to the Board (See Attached). Motion passed.

Mayor Hanson presented TVA InvestPrep Grant details. Tennessee Department of General Services contacted County Mayor Huffman to see if the county was interested in accepting 110,000 cubic yards of dirt from the Blue Oval City site. This dirt will be provided at no cost other than transporting it to the Rialto Industrial site. A total cost to transport this dirt is estimated at \$400,000.00. The County has approved \$200,000.00. Mayor Hanson requested the approval of \$200,000.00 for the transport fees for this dirt.

Motion was made by Alderman Edwards and seconded by Alderman Wallace to approve the appropriation not to exceed \$200,000.00 for the transport fees for the dirt to be move to the Rialto Industrial Site. Attorney Witherington will present the Resolution for approval for the funding to come out of the gas reserves for industrial development costs. Motion passed.

Mayor Hanson presented the Resolution designating officials the authority to issue ordinance summons for approval (See Attached).

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Justin Hanson.

Public Hearing regarding the consideration of a beer permit for Family Dollar Stores of Tennessee, LLC dba Family Dollar Store #22748 located at 605 Hwy 51 North for off premise consumption was called to order.

Mayor Hanson reported the Family Dollar Store #22748 failed inspection and the request for the consideration of a beer permit will be scheduled for a later date.

The General Welfare – Public Relations Committee met at City of Covington on August 9, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. with the following members present: Chairman Alderman Jeff Morris, Mayor Justin Hanson, and Alderman C H Sullivan. Also, present were Alderwoman Johnetta Yarbrough, Alderman Danny Wallace, Alderman Chris Richardson, Parks and Recreation Director Molly Glass, Museum Director Katherine Markley, Airport Manager Robin Anderson, Personnel Director Eboni Eaton, Police Chief Donna Turner, Public Works Director David Gray, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Chairman Alderman Morris called meeting to order.

Airport Manager Anderson reported July fuel sales totaling 8,492 gallons. Barge Design Consultant Benson Hadley reported on the state inspection violation. A tree violation was found during the inspection. He reported there will be an analysis of trees completed with the ALP Project. This aerial analysis will take approximately six months to complete. At the current time, the airport has been issued a temporary license. Airport Manager Anderson requested to talk to the property owners and purchase the single tree so that it can be removed.

Motion was made by Mayor Hanson and seconded by Alderman Morris to move forward with negotiations to address the violation of the single tree as indicated by TDOT.

Museum Director Markley reported the veteran of the month for August is Russell Crawford and will be recognized on August 9, 2022. The museum had 541 visitors for the month. A Community Foundations Grant has been received in the amount of \$1,800.00. The Tipton County's Lost Children Exhibit will be September 7th – November 9th. Trivia night will be on August 26th starting at 7:00 p.m. Cars & Coffee will be on August 27th beginning at 7:30 a.m.

Motion was made by Alderman Morris and seconded by Alderman Sullivan to accept the museum report. Motion passed.

Parks and Recreation Director Glass reported flag football started on Monday, August 8th. Fall sports signups will close on August 19th. Super Saturdays will be every Saturday in August. Classes will be offered from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at no cost. Cooking camp will be October 10th – October 13th. Isaac Hayes Day will be Saturday, August 20th, at Frazier Park from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. There were no events presented at the Special Events Committee. The bid for the roof repair at the Children & Family Services Building was presented for review. This bid is in the amount of \$24,700 and will be presented to the Finance & Administration Committee Meeting on August 16th for approval.

Pat Harcourt, A2H Representative, began discussion on the annexation of approximately 41 acres at the west end of Bert Johnston Avenue. The request will be to zone this annexed area as R1A, City/Moderate Density Residential District. He presented a plat showing 156 lots for homes ranging from 1500 to 3000 square feet. The plan of services will be presented to be reviewed at the Planning Commission Meeting. They will present a recommendation to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for approval.

Director Eaton began discussion on the repairs for the windows at the Civic Center. There has been water damage to the windows located on the third floor. She requested to bid for the replacement of the windows. There is a total of 49 windows with the third floor having 18 windows.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Wallace to bid the replacement of the 49 windows at the Civic Center.

Motion passed.

Director Glass presented the bid for approval on the roof repair at the Children & Family Services Building. The bid for approval is from Champion Roofing at a cost of \$24,700.00.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Morris to approve the bid to Champion Roofing in the amount of \$24,700.00 to repair the roof at the Children & Family Services Building.

Motion passed.

Director Glass began discussion on the fence for the Frazier Park Basketball Courts. This fence is required by insurance to secure the area to prevent damage to the courts.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderwoman Yarbrough to proceed with a bid for the fence to secure the area around the Frazier Park Basketball Courts. Motion passed.

Director Fisher presented Chapter 15 for review for the code update.

ORDINANCE 1753

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE COVINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE" BY ADOPTING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH TITLE 4 CHAPTER 2 ENTITLED <u>HUMAN RESOURCES SYSTEM</u>, SECTION 4-204 ENTITLED <u>HUMAN RESOURCES RULES AND REGULATIONS</u>, THE ATTACHED RULES AND REGULATIONS, EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK, AND WORK RULES FOR THE CITY OF COVINGTON, TENNESSEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF COVINGTON, TENNESSEE THAT:

Section 1. Title 4, Chapter 2, of the "Covington Municipal Code" is amended by adopting the attached Human Resources Rules and Regulations, Employee Handbook, and Work Rules in accordance with Section 4-204 entitled "<u>Human Resources Rules and Regulations</u>."

Section 2. If any provision of this Ordinance, or any policy or order thereafter, or the application of any provision to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this title, and the application of the provision of this title, or the policy or order to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, the welfare of the public requiring it.
