



I have been to your store on complaints about blocked aisles and blocked exits 7 seven time since January 15 2020 to August 8th 2022. I have sent inspection reports to you on what has to be done and what item that must be kept clear at all times. The City has spoken with our Attorney and we have been advised on how to proceed. The 1st violation blocking of the electrical panel must be kept accessible at all times IFC 2018 Fire Code section 604. 2nd violation Clear Exit aisles and aisles, corridors IFC Section 1024.1 & section 1024.2 and section 1003.6. With these violations not being address and possible other violations that may have been over looked due to the shape of the store. It is on the best interest of the citizens of Covington and other citizens traveling through our City that the Store at 960 HWY 51 N be closed to the public until the violations can be fix and an approved life safety inspection be completed.



Covington Fire Department Inspector Monthly Report July 18th 2022 to August 16th 2022

- After receiving several calls from our citizens about blocked aisles and exits and the Dollar General at 960 HWY 51 N being unsafe to walk around in. The Fire Department and Code Compliance office made several visits to the store and advised them what needed to be done ASAP to make the store safe, they failed to make it right.

After contacting the Cities Attorney about the issue, we were advised on what needed to be done on our parts and have the store closed until they could make the store safe again. On August 10th 2022, Chief Griggs and myself and Building Official Lessie Fisher went to Dollar General at 906 HWY 51 N to do a finial check. The store was still in and unsafe state and we shut the store down until they could get it safe enough to open and finish clean the old stock out. On Saturday the 13 2022 Building Official Fisher did a walk through and let them open. We advised them that a twice a week walk through would be done until the store was could pass a Life safety inspection. This week I have been in the store and it was a 100% improvement, they still like cleaning out the back store room to get rid old stock. But the store is looking good. I will continue to check on them to monitor their progress.

Personnel

The CPD currently has six (6) vacant positions of a total of 37:

- 1. Uniform Patrol (James Jordon: money Atoka PD)
- 2. Uniform Patrol (Freddie Braddic: hardship Henderson CO SO)
- 3. Uniform Patrol (Lt McGarity: resignation/retirement)
- 4. Uniform Patrol (Daniel Carter: resignation conduct)
- 5. Criminal Investigation Division (Det Dwayne Dowell Atoka PD)
- 6. Uniform Patrol Sergeant (Greg Templeton: resignation TCSO)

Administrative staff are conducting backgrounds on the police officer candidates. 10 were interviewed, 8 candidates were eliminated, 2 are being finalized. We have received new applications and an interview board will be conducted in August.

July Training

- On July 14, Sgt Nelson attended Terminal Agency Coordinator (TAC) training at TBI in Nashville. The training was for CPD to have a certified agent in NCIC. Sgt Nelson will be training CPD staff to maintain their certifications to use NCIC.
- On July 18- 19, Sgt. Taylor and Officer Powell attended Responding to an Active Shooter training that was hosted by the Dyersburg Police Dept. The Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Center in Nashville and the Tennessee Highway Patrol provided instructors.
- On July 20, 11 CPD officers attended Active Shooter training that was hosted by TCSO, at Dyersburg State Community College. This training incorporated Police, Fire and EMS into the many different scenarios.

Fleet

- The new Dodge Chargers are being utilized by the Patrol Division and were scheduled to be striped at Howards Tinting, on 08/18/22. Both have been striped.
- Chief Turner is assessing all CPD vehicles for vehicles to be assigned to the newly appointed School Resource Officer.

July Monthly Activity

- July 1 4th The Patrol Division conducted a THSO Operation. During the operations, there were multiple (217) citations for violations of speeding, hands-free driving, seatbelt, stop sign, registration, insurance, child restraint, anti-noise, no driver's license, and following too close. CPD Officers conducted two (2) traffic crash investigations. There were no fatalities and one minor injury. During the operations there were twenty (25) arrests.

- July 6 CPD Command staff attended the monthly Crime Driver Meeting hosted by the District Attorney's Office at the National Guard Armory.
- July 7 Lt Ginn attended the Special Events meeting

- July 19 Chief Turner and Lt McCurry attended the Sexual Assault and Resource and Response Team (SARRT) Organizational Meeting at the District Attorney's Office in Ripley, TN.
- July 19 Aug 11th Six (6) CPD staff members attended the TCAT Excel Training at the Covington Technology Center.
- July 19 Chief Turner was a speaker at the Blue Oval Community Event at the Civic Center, organized by County Commissioner Shelia Barlow.
- July 21 23 Chief Turner attended the Tennessee Association of Chief of Police in Chattanooga. The Board voted me in as a member.

- July 25 CPD had the annual THSO audit. There were no findings. The audit resulted in CPD being awarded additional funding due to current operation efforts in Covington.

- Chief Turner held a weekly Command Staff meeting each Monday.





Covington Police Department has made an arrest in a vehicle theft investigation

On 06 March 2022 Covington Police Department began an investigation into the theft of a 2006 Chevrolet Monte Carlo from the **1900 block of Cottonwood Place in Covington**. The victim reported she went to walk her dog and upon her return to the residence she noticed the vehicle missing. There was no forcible entry into the home and the keys were missing.

On 24 April 2022, the Memphis Police Department conducted a traffic stop on the stolen vehicle traveling northbound on N. McLean from Poplar Ave. The vehicle was being driven by Kaylee Crean, from Memphis TN. Crean was arrested and charged accordingly by the Memphis Police Department. CPD detectives began a joint investigation with the Memphis Police Department into the case.

Crean later made a statement to Covington Police Department detectives that her boyfriend had bought the vehicle for \$500.00 from a white female but was unsure of her name. During the investigation, the identity of the female who sold the vehicle, was determined to be the daughter of the victim, **Jessica Beloate**. At the time of the theft, Beloate was residing on McWilliams Road in Drummonds, TN. Beloate was transported to the Covington Police Department and interviewed regarding the theft of the vehicle. Jessica denied any involvement in the vehicle theft but evidence in the case resulted in her arrest.

"I appreciate the assistance by the Memphis Police Department staff in locating the vehicle, assisting detectives in connecting the cases, and determining who the real thief was in this case". *said Police Chief Donna Turner* "Jessica Beloate was charged with Theft of Property over \$1000 and Criminal Simulation. Beloate remains in custody with a \$5,000.00 bond at the Tipton County jail awaiting her July 15th General Sessions Court appearance."

Covington Police Department conducted traffic safety operations on the Fourth of July Weekend.

The Covington Police Department partnered with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office to conduct multiple traffic safety operations throughout the city of Covington during the Fourth of July Weekend (July 1st – 4th). The State of Tennessee's focus of the operations was on speeding, hands-free driving, and seatbelt violators.

During the four-day holiday weekend, officers conducted observation details and had mobile teams in highly-traveled areas and targeted areas where CPD has recently received complaints of speeders, reckless driving, and traffic violations. Some of these locations were identified from the statistical data collected from our mobile traffic trailers. The trailers are stationary in selected areas to determine traffic flow and speeds. This provides specific times needed for traffic enforcement efforts to proactively address traffic safety issues.

During the operations, there were multiple (217) citations for violations of speeding, hands-free driving, seatbelt, stop sign, registration, insurance, child restraint, anti-noise, no driver's license, and following too close. CPD Officers conducted two (2) traffic crash investigations. There were no fatalities and one minor injury.

The Covington Police Department is seeking the community's assistance in an overnight fatal shooting in North Covington.

On 09 July 2022 at about 9:30 PM Covington Police Department (CPD) Officers responded to a shots fired call in the **Stevens Avenue area in Covington**. At the scene, officers observed multiple cartridge casings in the roadway and a blue Ford Mustang car crashed approximately 500 feet in a yard in the 200 block of Stevens Avenue. Officers approached the vehicle and identified a shooting victim. Officers began lifesaving efforts until Tipton County EMS arrived and transported the victim to Baptist Memorial Hospital Tipton. The victim was identified as **Ralph Alexander**, **32 of Brighton** who succumbed from his injuries.

CPD Detectives responded to the scene and was assisted by Sheriff Shannon Beasley and the Tipton County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) staff. District Attorney Mark Davidson, Inv Tommy White, and Tipton County Medical Examiner Dr. Buffy Cook joined efforts in the homicide investigation. The preliminary investigation determined a party was being held in the 1800 block of Wooten Street. The victim had left work, at an area factory, attended the party, and upon leaving in the Ford Mustang, was fatally shot in the 300 block of Stevens Avenue.

Detectives worked throughout the night at the scene speaking to citizens and gathering video of the area to determine vehicles involved and confirm the identity of the suspects. While still at the first scene, at about midnight, a second complaint of **multiple gunshots in the area of Bledsoe and Feezor Street** was reported to Tipton County Central Dispatch. Upon arrival by CPD officers and TCSO deputies, over forty (40) casings were recovered in the 200 block of Feezor. A home was struck by the rounds penetrating the walls and windows. The suspects who had walked through yards, fired the shots, and then fled in a vehicle. Detectives processed the scene, and the **homeowner**, **Linda Grant**, confirmed no one at the residence was injured in the incident.

The motive for the shootings is unconfirmed but through the investigations have been determined to be connected. There is a nexus between the incidents and the alleged suspects who are in rival gangs.

"We are asking for assistance from the community who may have seen a vehicle fleeing from the areas from both shootings. We feel the suspects may have exited vehicles and walked in the shadows to commit these cowardly violent acts. If citizens would check their home surveillance systems, it could aid us in getting a break on the case. I want to thank Sheriff Beasley and the TCSO staff who responded and assisted at both scenes and at the hospital." said Chief Donna Turner "Initial information reveals there will be multiple suspects in both cases. I appreciate the citizens who have stepped up and provided leads and information of possible suspects. These citizens have united with us to take their community back from the few who enter their communities to recklessly endanger everyone. We are actively pursuing these suspects and want to prevent additional retaliation of more violence. The citizens who may provide information in these cases and others will remain anonymous."

On 25 July 2022 at about 6:30 PM Covington Police Department (CPD) officers met with Landan Smith who reported he was robbed at gunpoint by two (2) men in Broadmeadows Apartment Complex located at 150 Peeler Rd. Smith stated a rifle was taken from him by the alleged robbers and then they fled on foot. Smith provided descriptions and named one of the suspects. Officers completing the initial follow up into the case located the suspects, recovered the weapons and detained the two men.

While conducting the investigation, witnesses of the accused robbers voluntarily came to the Criminal Investigations Division and met with detectives. The witnesses cooperated and provided electronic and eyewitness accounts that could be verified by surveillance video and other witnesses. The additional information resulted in the release of the two men before being formally charged in the case.

On 27 July 2022 detectives determined a transaction occurred on a previous date, involving the exchange of the rifle for a pistol. Smith and one of the individuals, he stated robbed him, were involved in this transaction where property was exchanged. Detectives interviewed Smith and due to conflicting statements, he provided in the case, Smith was charged with filing a false report. Smith is slated to appear in Tipton County General Sessions Court on 23 August 2022 and has a \$2,500.00 bond.

"This is a great example of how when witnesses are cooperative with detectives the facts can be revealed in cases. I appreciate these witnesses stepping up and doing the right thing for the right reasons." said Chief Donna Turner "I appreciate the CPD officers and detectives who worked tirelessly to "get it right" unveiling the false allegations against these men"
