The Board of Mayor and Aldermen met at City of Covington on March 28, 2023at 5:30 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Jan Hensley, Aldermen: Jeff Morris, Danny Wallace, C H Sullivan, Chris Richardson, Jean Johnson, and John Edwards. Also, present were Building Official Lessie Fisher, Public Works Director David Gray, Personnel Director Eboni Eaton, Parks and Recreation Director Molly Glass, Police Chief Donna Turner, Fire Chief Richard Griggs, City Attorney Rachel Witherington, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jan Hensley.

Invocation was given by Alderman C H Sullivan.

The General Welfare – Public Safety Committee met at City of Covington on March 28, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Jan Hensley, Alderman Chris Richardson, Alderman John Edwards, and Alderman C H Sullivan. Also, present were Police Chief Donna Turner, Fire Chief Richard Griggs, Public Works Director David Gray, Building Official Lessie Fisher, Alderman Jeff Morris, Alderwoman Jean Johnson, Alderman Danny Wallace, Assistant to the Mayor Jason Fleming, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Meeting was called to order by Chairman Alderman Chris Richardson.

Fire Chief Griggs reported he will attend the Tennessee Fire Chiefs meeting April 10th-14th. The department attended the Pathways to Possibilities career expo in Ripley on March 8th-9th. There were 37 hours worked by the volunteers in March, 2023. The run report was presented showing 188 calls from February 23, 2023 to March 23, 2023. The county coverage area collections are \$76,575.00 for 2023. The invoice for the oil spill cleanup was presented in the amount of \$677.95. This invoice was sent to Reedy and Company Realtors. The floor and repairs are complete. The Hall Street warning siren will be repaired. The care and fire inspection reports were presented for review. The department has been approved for the Public Entity Safety Partners Grant in the amount of \$3,000.00 which will be used to purchase turnout gear. The Drivers Safety Grant in the amount of \$869.99 was received for the purchase of the cameras.

Motion was made by Alderman Edwards and seconded by Alderman Sullivan to approve the fire department report.

Motion passed.

Chief Turner reported there are seven vacant positions. Chief Turner joined the Legislative Committee for the State. All staff attended mandatory Crowd Control Training at the National Guard Armory. The CPD has crowd control equipment but had not received training to utilize it properly. The monthly activity report was presented. The statistics for the month were presented showing 1,338 calls for the month and 150 traffic stops. Chief Turner presented a K9 Activity Log for review. Officer Merkle will be graduating from Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy on Friday, March 31, 2023.

Motion was made by Alderman Edwards and seconded by Alderman Sullivan to approve the police department report.

Motion passed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:19 p.m.

The Public Works Committee met at City of Covington on April 4, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. with the following members present: Chairman Alderman Danny Wallace, Alderman Jeff Morris, and Mayor Jan Hensley. Also present were Public Works Director David Gray, Alderman C H Sullivan, Alderman Chris Richardson, Utilities Manager Calvin Johnson, Assistant to the Mayor Jason Fleming, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Chairman Alderman Wallace called meeting to order.

Mayor Hensley gave an update on the disaster recovery efforts. Research is being conducted on having an outside company remove and haul debris. Also, due to the damages to Crestview Elementary School and Middle School, a plan to place a temporary building at Baltzer Field is being researched. This building will be provided by Blue Oval City.

Public Works Director Gray reported he attended the TDOT Pre-Construction meeting for safety improvements on S.R. 59. The projected start date for these improvements begin on April 17th. The project will include upgrades to guard rails, signage, and striving. There is a preliminary design for a roundabout, but this is not included in this project. The West Tennessee Regionalization Opportunity Assessment was presented for the committee to review. This study was to address regional wastewater needs in Tipton, Fayette, and Haywood Counties through 2043. There are four viable alternatives that were developed as potential solutions for how cities, counties, and utility districts can meet future wastewater demand. The cost for these alternatives ranges from \$350,000.00 to 1,385,000.00. There was a meeting held by FEMA/TEMA to brief applicants for severe weather events. The ARP non-competitive grants have started to be awarded to organizations. Other applicants for these non-competitive grants should be notified within the next ten days. There are webinars becoming available for the ARP Competitive Grants for three different types of projects. Thes projects are regionalization, water reuse, and resource protection. A webinar on April 11, 2023 will provide more information. The generator for the Wastewater Treatment Plant has been ordered. The old generator has been repaired and will be used until the new generator arrives. The application for the 2023 Multimodal Grant is available. Director Gray requested to apply for sidewalks on Mueller Brass Road connecting the Fox Hollow, Cottonwood, and Glendale communities to the South Fire Station.

Motion was made by Mayor Hensley and seconded by Alderman Morris to approve the report from Public Works Director David Gray.

Moton passed.
