The Board of Mayor and Aldermen met at City of Covington on June 27, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. with the following members present: Vice-Mayor Jeff Morris Aldermen: C.H. Also present were Parks and Recreation Director Molly Glass, Fire Chief Richard Griggs, Public Works Director David Gray, Building Official Lessie Fisher, Police Chief Donna Turner, City Attorney Rachel Witherington, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn

Meeting was called to order by Vice-Mayor Jeff Morris.

Invocation was given by Vice-Mayor Jeff Morris.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was led by Alderman Chris Richardson.

Motion was made by Alderman Danny Wallace and seconded by Alderwoman Jean Johnson that the Minutes of the Preceding Meeting be approved as distributed to the Board (See Attached). Motion passed.

City Attorney Rachel Witherington presented the PILOT Agreement between United Church Residences of Covington, TN and the City of Covington for approval (See Attached). This agreement will begin January 1, 2024. The City and County will both receive \$2,692.50. The United Church will pay the sum of \$31,200.00 for the time period beginning on January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2023. This amount will be divided equally between the City and County. The PILOT Agreement with Glendale Commons will be presented for approval on July 11, 2023.

The General Welfare – Public Safety Committee met at City of Covington on June 27, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. with the following members present: Chairman Alderman Chris Richardson, Alderman John Edwards, and Alderman C H Sullivan. Also, present were Police Chief Donna Turner, Fire Chief Richard Griggs, Public Works Director David Gray, Alderman Jeff Morris, Alderwoman Jean Johnson, Alderman Danny Wallace, Assistant to the Mayor Jason Fleming, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Meeting was called to order by Chairman Alderman Chris Richardson.

Fire Chief Griggs reported Zac Cook was this year's recipient of the Exchange Club Firefighter of the year. There were 5 hours worked by the volunteers in May, 2023. The run report was presented showing 228 calls from May 18, 2023, to June 22, 2023. The county coverage area collections are \$79,875.00 for 2023. The Magna grip ventilation system was damaged and will be inspected by the mechanical contractor. The weather sirens are being repaired. The fiscal year 2021 Assistance to Firefighters Grant in the amount of \$35,238.09 has been awarded. The fire inspection report was presented for review. Driver Zack Mathis last day with the department was June 8th. Joshua Posey has been promoted to driver. Volunteer Firefighter Cody Peeler has been hired for the vacant firefighter's position.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Richardson to approve the fire department report.

Motion passed.

Chief Turner reported there are nine vacant positions. Officer Kenneth Preyer graduated from TLETA on June 23, 2023. The monthly activity report was presented. The statistics for the month were presented showing 1,849 calls for the month and 157 traffic stops. The Memorandum for Understanding with Tipton County and Tipton Christian Academy have been signed. Applications for the statewide school resource officer program have been submitted.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Edwards to approve the police department report.

Motion passed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:20 p.m.

#### AGREEMENT FOR PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES

THIS AGREEMENT FOR PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES (this "Agreement") entered into on July \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2023 is made and entered into by and between <u>UCC XXI</u>, Inc., a not-for-profit corporation ("hereinafter also referred to as "Glendale Commons"), the <u>City of Covington</u>, <u>Tennessee</u> (hereinafter also referred to as the "City") and <u>Tipton County</u>, <u>Tennessee</u> (hereinafter also referred to as the "County"), regarding payments in lieu of real property tax to be made by Glendale Commons to City and County.

WHEREAS, Glendale Commons is the owner of a certain parcel of real property located at 351 Mueller Brass Rd., Covington, TN 38019, which parcel is more particularly described as Map 50, Parcel 40.06 in Tipton County, Tennessee (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Glendale Commons is a 43-unit apartment building providing residences for low income elderly persons; and

WHEREAS, T.C.A. § 67-5-207 states that property of Tennessee not-for-profit corporations that is used for permanent housing of low income persons with disabilities or low income elderly persons which is financed by various federal programs is exempted from real property taxes, so long as such property complies with the provisions of said T.C.A. § 67-5-207; and

WHEREAS, T.C.A. § 67-5-207(a)(2) provides for payments in lieu of real property taxes to be made by owners of projects exceeding twelve (12) units and granted an exemption under § 67-5-207 in an amount negotiated to cover the costs of improvements, facilities or services rendered by the tax jurisdiction and said payments shall not be less then twenty-five (25%) of the amount of tax that would be due if the property were not exempt; and

WHEREAS, although the Property was built in 2009 and has been in operation since that time the parties never entered into an agreement for payment in lieu of taxes, and no funds have been paid by Glendale Commons nor received by the City or County since that time; and

WHEREAS, Glendale Commons, the City and the County all desire to enter this Agreement for payments in lieu of real property taxes to be made by Glendale Commons to the City and the County, in accordance with T.C.A. § 67-5-207(a)(2).

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES AND COVENANTS SET OUT HEREIN, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Beginning effective as of January 1, 2024 Glendale Commons shall pay to the City and County for each calendar year (and pro rata for any part of a calendar year for which the tax exemption is in effect) the total annual sum of \$9,954 in payments in lieu of real property tax, which is twenty-five percent (25%) of the total property tax that would be owed if the Property were not exempt (the "Annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes").
- 2. Glendale Commons, the City, and the County acknowledge and agree that Glendale Commons owes \$135,925 for payments in lieu of taxes owed with respect to the Property for the time period beginning when the Property was constructed in 2009 through December 31, 2023 (the "Back Payments In Lieu of Taxes"). The Back Payments In Lieu of Taxes will be paid by Glendale Commons as provided herein. On or before August 1, 2023 Glendale Commons will pay the sum of \$78,385 in satisfaction of a portion of the Back Payments In Lieu of Taxes (the "Initial Payment"). Following the Initial Payment, Glendale will pay the balance of the Back Payments In Lieu of Taxes, or \$57,540, in five (5) equal annual installments of \$11,508 in the years 2024 through and including 2028, and each annual installment payment will be made at same time as the Annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes (for a total annual payment by Glendale Commons of \$21,462). Upon the payment by Glendale Commons of the total amount of the Back Payments In Lieu of Taxes, all outstanding payments in lieu of taxes owed on the Property for all periods prior to January 1, 2024 shall be deemed to have been satisfied in full, and Glendale Commons will not owe any additional funds (including, but not limited to, any property taxes, payments in lieu of property taxes, or interest or penalties) to the City or County with respect to such time period.
- 3. The total Annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes described hereinabove in Paragraph 1 shall be divided equally between the City and the County.
- 4. Subject to Paragraph 6 below, the payments in lieu of tax required by this Agreement are to be made on or before December 1<sup>st</sup> of each year to both the City and the County. Any payments in lieu of tax hereunder not made when due shall thereafter (and until paid in full) bear interest at the lower interest rate of five percent (5%) per annum or the highest interest rate then allowable under applicable law.

- 5. Subject to Paragraph 6 below, the payments in lieu of tax provided for in Paragraph 1 shall continue to be due and payable in the amounts specified herein until the date of which the Property is no longer eligible for real property tax exemption under T.C.A. § 67-5-207.
- 6. The parties to this Agreement acknowledge that the costs to the City and the County to provide improvements, facilities and services to the Property are greater than the amount of the payments in lieu of tax to be made pursuant to this Agreement, and further acknowledge that such costs may increase substantially during the time the Property is entitled to exemption from real property taxes. In consideration of the agreement by the City and County to accept payments in lieu of real property tax in amounts less that costs of providing improvements, facilities and services to the Property and to lessen the burden on the City and the County Glendale Commons agrees that it will from time to time, upon request, cooperate with the City and/or the County to seek increased funding for payments in lieu of tax from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development or any other governmental funding source. The parties further agree to renegotiate in good faith the amount of the payments in lieu of taxes every five (5) years, consistent with the requirement of applicable law governing the amount of such payments in lieu of taxes.
- 7. Glendale Commons acknowledges and agrees that the payments in lieu of tax provided for herein are entirely separate from, and in addition to, any payments that may be required for sanitation, water, sewer, gas, electricity or any similar services that may be imposed on all residents of the City or County now or in the future.
- 8. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the law of the State of Tennessee.
- 9. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and shall be enforceable by and against, the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.
- 10. Glendale Commons represents and warrants that it is a not-for-profit corporation duly qualified to transact business in the State of Tennessee; that it has received and at all times during the period of this Agreement will maintain federal income tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; and that it is, and the Property is, and that it and the Property at all times during the period of this Agreement will remain, in compliance with the documents and instruments that set forth the terms and conditions of the financing under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to which the

Property is subject, the National Housing Act of 1959 and other applicable law affecting eligibility for exemption from real property taxes.



WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> the Planning Commission has asked for the endorsement of the existing provisions by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COVINGTON BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN:

**SECTION 1** that the City of Covington delegates authority in accordance with the City's Municipal and Regional Subdivision Regulations:

- Whenever subdivisions meet the criteria described below, the Secretary of the Covington Municipal-Regional Planning Commission may approve a subdivided plat without the approval of the Planning Commission.
  - a. The divided tracts involve no more than two (2) lots;
  - b. The planning staff of the Planning Commission certifies that the subdivision meets all the regulations adopted by the Planning Commission, and;
  - c. No request for variance from the adopted regulations of the Planning Commission has been made.
  - d. Re-subdivision involving no more than two (2) lots or establishing new or additional utility easements.

SECTION 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage,
THE PUBLIC WELFARE REQUIRING IT.
