





Volunteer Fire Assistance



The Tennessee Department of Agriculture, Division of Forestry will be accepting applications for the FY 2023 Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) Program beginning September 1st through October 14th, 2022. Fire departments that serve a population of less than 10,000 will be eligible to apply to receive a VFA Wildland Fire Suppression Kit for their department to supplement their wildland firefighting capacity. These kits will consist of wildland firefighting personal protective equipment (PPE) and tools valued at approximately \$3,000 per kit.

Before participating in this program, a fire department must be legally organized and have a current Memorandum of Understanding with the Division of Forestry that is dated after June 30, 2017. If you do not have one, please contact the <u>Assistant District Forester in your area</u>.

Kits will be awarded in November 2023.

FY 2024 Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) Grant Schedule

September 1 – October 13, 2023	Applications for wildland fire suppression kits accepted.
October 16 – November 3, 2023	Applications are reviewed and rated by Assistant District Foresters.
November 6, 2023	Applications with departments approved to receive wildland fire suppression kits are forwarded to the VFA Grant Program Administrator.
January 8, 2024	Departments are notified that they have been accepted to receive a wildland fire suppression kit. Supplies for Kits are ordered by the State Purchasing Specialist and shipped to districts. Arrangements are made with Departments to pick up kits once all materials have been received.
February 29, 2024	Distribution of Kits to departments complete.

Covington Police Department arrests former teacher Alissa McCommon on new criminal charges of coercion of a witness, aggravated stalking, and harassment.

On 8 September 2023, the Covington Police Department (CPD) arrested Alissa McCommon for rape of a child. McCommon posted bond and was subsequently released by the Court on conditional bond of no contact with the victim or any minors other than her own children. On 26 September 2023, the CPD Criminal Investigation Division (CID) received information that former teacher Alissa McCommon, 38, of Covington, TN, using a previously unknown phone number, initiated additional contact with a victim.

The evidence indicates McCommon texted a victim, using a specific code word known to the juvenile as a code word McCommon would previously utilize to confirm that the juvenile was alone, often before sending nude photographs on SnapChat. After using the code word on 28 September 2023, the evidence indicates Mccommon sent multiple text messages to victim indicating he would "regret doing this." McCommon, using the same number, also admitted to a sexual encounter with the victim.

Covington Police Chief Donna Turner stated, "the actions of McCommon are not only appalling, but CPD is also concerned about this apparent violation of her bond conditions. Due to the nature of the communications, we are concerned others may have been contacted. "We continue to work closely with the District Attorneys' Office as to the revocation of McCommon's bond, as well as the additional charges that continue to develop."

McCommon was arrested today at her Covington home and transported to the Tipton County jail. McCommon is being held without bond pending her appearance in Tipton County General Sessions Court. She has been charged with coercion of a witness, aggravated stalking, tampering with evidence, and harassment.

This investigation continues to develop related to victims in similar circumstances. If your child has been contacted by an unknown number, CPD can check that information for you and would like to in order to ensure that such abuse does not continue. Please contact the Covington

The Covington Police Department and Tipton County Sheriff's Office are jointly investigating allegations of sexual misconduct involving a local teacher and multiple juveniles.

On 24 August 2023, the Covington Police Department (CPD) Criminal Investigation Division (CID) received information from a referral filed with the Tennessee Department of Children Services (DCS) regarding allegations of sexual misconduct that had been reported, involving a teacher and a former student. CPD detectives began the investigation and confirmed the teacher had been suspended without pay from her position by Tipton County Schools due to the allegations.

The teacher was identified as Alissa McCommon, 38, of Covington, TN. Multiple juvenile victims have come forth stating that they were befriended by their former teacher, McCommon, who began playing video games with them, and then further engaged with them through mobile phone social media apps, which led to her allegedly sending inappropriate photographs and requesting sexual relations with the victims. McCommon admitted to communicating inappropriately with former students. There has been no evidence that any of the alleged activities occurred on any school campus. The Tipton County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) detectives began working jointly with CPD detectives after receiving information regarding a victim or victims who were exposed to similar circumstances within the county's jurisdiction, outside of Covington city limits. The investigation is continuing in nature as the evidence further develops. Further specific allegations are omitted due to the involvement of minors as victims.

Today, Alissa McCommon was arrested and charged with Rape of a Child. McCommon was transported to the Tipton County jail and a \$25,000.00 bond has been set in the case. Detectives with both the Tipton County Sheriff's Office and Covington Police Department continue to interview witnesses and identifying victims in the case. Detectives have met with the District Attorney's Office about the ongoing multi-jurisdictional investigation. Additional charges are expected.

"Covington Police Department Detectives continue to investigate this terrible exploitation and abuse of these young boys. We expect to also develop the investigation to determine accountability of other adults in the case, including those who were aware of the abuse, and those who allowed or provided locations for such illegal acts to occur. I am thankful for the continued assistance by Tipton County School officials during this investigation." said Chief Donna Turner. "I have also spoken with the US Attorney's Office, and we intend to pursue any appropriate federal charges related to the sexual exploitation of these victims utilizing cellphones, inappropriate relations, and activities across jurisdictional State lines. We will prosecute this case to the fullest and will continue to support the victims and their families during all aspects of the investigation."

Covington Police Department Detectives make an arrest in an aggravated domestic violence case.

On 24 August 2023 at approximately 3:00 pm, Covington Police Department received a report of an aggravated domestic assault incident which occurred in the **1200 block of Surrey Hill Place in Covington**. CPD detectives met with the victim, Hannah Voss, at the Criminal Investigation Division (CID) where it was revealed that there were 2 other adult female victims involved. Officers confirmed that an Order of Protection had been filed in Tipton County Chancery Court. CPD officers and detectives served the order of protection and as directed in the Court Order, took custody of multiple firearms for safe keeping at the residence until the hearing in Chancery Court.

Detectives interviewed each victim who described multiple physical altercations between them and the alleged suspect during the incident which lasted over a period of days and for years in some reports. The alleged suspect was identified as **Jonathan Voss**, **30**, **of the Surrey Hill Place address in Covington**, **TN**. The investigation confirmed that during some of the violent outbursts at the residence, the couple's two (2) young children were present. Detectives were assisted in the case by the Carl Perkins Child Abuse Center for interviewing and providing resources for the children.

Detectives were able to recover electronic evidence and other evidence that corroborated the statements that were given from the victims. Detectives obtained a search warrant for the Surrey Hill Place residence and executed it on 30 August 2023. Detectives recovered evidence related to the alleged assaults and recovered multiple tubes of nonprescription anabolic steroids and a large amount of EMT related medical supplies.


On 31 August 2023 Detectives located Jonathan Voss and he was given an opportunity to be interviewed at the CID Building. Voss chose not to provide a statement. Detectives arrested Voss and transported him to the Tipton County jail. Voss was formally charged him with 3 counts of Aggravated Domestic Assault, 3 counts of Kidnapping, 2 Counts of Interference with 911, and Possession of Schedule III and held pending a bond hearing by Judge Peeler


in Tipton County General Sessions Court. On 01 September 2023 a bond hearing was held, and Voss was released on a \$25,000.00 bond until his preliminary hearing later this month.


"In domestic violence cases we often find victims hesitate reporting or refrain from immediately seeking assistance in violent issues due to the family dynamics or fear of retaliation by those parties involved." said Chief Donna Turner "If you are in a domestic violence situation, I urge you to report the incident so we can provide resources for everyone involved and possibly prevent the violence from continuing in the home. 


