Presentation from Suez on AMI Metering – Mr. Tracy Fearnley

Video shown regarding smart meters, meter replacement program

Joe Kelly discussed AMI (Advanced Metering Infrastructure) being affordable for small communities and how system is managed.

Value proposition

- Sole service offering – no 3rd party vendor

- Suez owns maintenance program

- Designed for small to mid-size utilities

- Suez assumes all technological risks, protects from obsolescence

- Continuous supervision & failure investigation

- Software updates and training

- 24 reads per day vs. 12 reads per year – provides greater analytics

Alderman Wallace inquired about features and options, for example, remote disconnect

Utilities Dept. submitted to David Gray reasons why automated meters would be a benefit

Alderman Morris inquired about feedback on system. Per Suez, residents easily adapt to new system.

Improves customer service when customer calls, utility rep will have more accurate information.

System can read both water and gas

David Gray to move forward in gathering info needed and collaborating with Suez on details

Highway 51 Paving

Supposed to be done in June

One bid submitted to State and came in too high

State decided to change bid packet and rebid

Bid opens 8/9

David should have update next week

Our paving, 3rd week of August, possibly September, should take about a week to be completed

Water Treatment Plant Aerators

Aerator 2 completed and back online

Aerator 1 should be online by the end of the week

Sanitation Rates

July 1, sanitation rates increased 1.9%

Shared dumpsters, inventorying them now, some discrepancies realized

Gasification Update

Southern Environmental Services met with the State Tuesday

Expect about 50 days for permit

Use of existing building and possibly addition to building already at site

Discussing lease with Rachel Witherington

Once permit is in place, would like to be up and running in 5 days

Possibly 25-35 employees needed

Alderman Wallace inquired about several pieces of equipment at plant. Per David Gray, we could possibly offer it for sale or auction.

Waste Water Plant and Water Treatment Plant has seen great improvements

Water Main Extension S. College / Hastings Way

Completed and should be under budget

Water pressure and fire protection will be greater

Water Main & Gas Main across town creek replacement

Design did not go under town creek, went over the creek.

Will have to bore 10" water main & 4" gas under creek and out other side

Money will come from asset account instead of from budget

Approx. \$20K on water side, Approx. \$12K on gas side

Alderwoman Bommer made motion to allow David to proceed not to exceed \$35,000. Approved.

First Utility and Main gate regulator stations replacement

CDBG Sewer Grant Update

\$550K grant for sewer repair






COVINGTON AQUATIC CENTER

Veteran of the Month August 2019

Gaetano “Guy” Critelli



The Tipton County Museum Veteran of the Month for August 2019 is Gaetano “Guy” Critelli. He was born in Niagara Falls, New York and at age 10 he and his family relocated to the Sunshine State of Florida. There he joined the Navy right out of high school on the buddy system as an undesignated Fireman in September of 1988. His buddy went to Norfolk for duty, but he went to the Philippines onboard the USS STERETT (CG-31). He was assigned to the Boiler Room where he struck for and successfully became a Boiler Technician. For the next 20 years, he traveled the world with sea tours onboard the USS NASSAU (LHA-4), onboard USS KEARSARGE (LHD-3) where he was a plank owner and part of the commissioning crew, and USS ESSEX (LHD-2). His shore duty assignments were varied and included tours as a member of the Security Police in Naval Air Facility Atsugi, Japan and recruiting duty in Buffalo, New York where he was selected as Classifier of the Year for Region North. During his tour in Buffalo the Navy eliminated the Boiler Technician rating and force converted Guy into the Machinist Mate rating. His final tour was with Port Operations at Naval Station Pearl Harbor where he was in charge of the USS ARIZONA Navy Detachment and the Pacific Region Ceremonial Guard. He retired from the United States Navy in September 2008 as Machinist Mate Chief Petty Officer.






