Flock Safety Cameras

- Company founded 2 years ago
- Infrastructure, deployed quickly, captures vehicle fingerprint, license plate
- Nat'l average 13% clearance rate
- Allows LE to be proactive and reactive
- Tracks certain plates, allows LE to filter info
- Cobb Co, GA—70 Flock Cameras - 34% reduction in crime
- Police, City initial install. HOA's, Subdivisions will possibly purchase additional
- Privacy, not connected with knowing who is driving what vehicle
- State recognition on plates, able to eliminate false positives
- Able to pick up pedestrians, bicyclists, pets
- Able to do full or partial tags
- Anyone on hotlist, alerts are sent within 15 seconds, custom hotlist available
- Price point, \$2000 per camera, per year. Covers install, software, hardware, maintenance, warranty
- Everything covered under contract, even storage
- Timeline, once contract is in place, 15-25 cameras, 6-8 week window
- Data is stored for 30 days
- 2 year contract, annual payment
- Will do a pilot program, put up cameras and let us try for 60 days, can adjust accordingly after that. Recommend 5-10 cameras for pilot program.
- Alderman Phelps recommends that we bring newly appointed Police Chief into discussion
- Alderman Wallace mentioned that this would need to be brought to Finance Committee

- Several officers have left to go to another organization
- 22 certified officers as of next week
- We are fully staffed at 37
- New Police Chief will be involved in handling new hires.
- Keith Phelps mentioned that there may be a called meeting held during this period

Heat Exhaustion & Heat Stroke

Symptoms

Heat Exhaustion

- Headaches
- Dizziness or lightheadedness
- Weakness
- Mood changes such as irritability
- Confusion or the inability to think straight
- Upset stomach—vomiting
- Fainting or passing out
- Pale, clammy skin

Heat Stroke

- Dry, pale skin with no sweating
- Hot, red skin that looks sunburned
- Mood changes such as irritability
- Confusion or the inability to think straight
- Seizures or fits
- Unconsciousness with no response

What You Can Do

- Avoid eating large meals in hot environments.
- Avoid alcohol or beverages with caffeine.
- Have workers trained about heat-induced illnesses.

To Whom It May Concern:

The City of Covington Water Department would like to use your residence as a sampling location for Lead and Copper testing. Please fill out and return the enclosed survey if you would like your home to be tested for these contaminants as a free service from the City of Covington Water Department. If you are able to participate and meet the requirements, we will deliver a sample kit to your residence. Each sample kit includes easy-to-follow instructions for collection. After collection, the kit can be left on your doorstep and will be picked up by our personnel the next day in the same manner it was delivered.

Participating in this study provides crucial information about the quality of your drinking water, the community's health and the integrity of our water lines.

Important information from the EPA regarding Lead:

Lead can cause serious health problems if too much enters your body from drinking water or other sources. It can cause damage to the brain and kidneys, and can interfere with the production of red blood cells that carry oxygen to all parts of your body. Adults with kidney problems and high blood pressure can be affected by low levels of lead more than healthy adults. Lead is stored in the bones, and it can be released later in life.

The greatest risk of lead exposure is to infants, young children, and pregnant women. During pregnancy, the child receives lead from the mother's bones, which may affect brain development. Lead can also be transferred through breastmilk to nursing infants. Scientists have linked the effects of lead on the brain with lowered IQ in children.

After the sample is tested, the results of your sample will be delivered directly to you.

Your home's cooperation and participation in this study is greatly appreciated by the City of Covington Water Department. We thank you for contributing your time and effort into this public health monitoring effort.

We will be glad to pick up the survey. Can be mailed to or dropped off at city hall or water plant.





Free Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services

Who Qualifies for the Tennessee Behavioral Health Safety Net Program

The Behavioral Health Safety Net Program is funded by the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and designed for adults with no health coverage and who meet certain criteria

Currently funds are available to provide mental health and substance abuse services for adults ages 18 and older who meet the following criteria:

- Do not have TENNCARE or other health coverage
- Be a US Citizen
- Be a resident of Tennessee
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have a household income at or below 138% of the Federal Poverty Level:
 - Single Adult less than \$17,236 per year
 - A family of 2 making less than \$23,336 per year
 - A family of three making less than \$29,435 all qualify




