
- Training going well
- Working property maintenance concerns, addressing issues before they become blight issues
- Started working on goals for Code Enforcement in the strategic plan, brought forth previously by Pinnacle Group
 - ◆ Hwy 51 corridor, entryways into the City
 - ◆ Need to shore up ordinances
 - ◆ Attorney Witherington states:
 - *Zoning for Hwy 51 corridor, all parcels of real estate touching Hwy 51
 - *Mostly zoned B-2, some R-1, some R-2
 - *Planning Commission has recommended to the Board that zoning on the Highway 51 corridor be studied and amended, and while doing so to pass a resolution putting a temporary, partial moratorium on any zoning changes in the corridor
 - *Would like the Board of Mayor and Aldermen to pass a partial, temporary moratorium on approving any new development, re-zoning, text amendments or variances for 6 months in the B-2 district and in R-1 and R-2 districts that are contiguous to Highway 51 in order to study changes in zoning and amend the zoning ordinance
 - *Would like to look into creating Design Review Commission
 - *This would not affect any new development or zoning changes in these districts that has already been approved by the planning commission
 - *Nothing for the Public Works Committee to do at this time, just providing information on the moratorium before going in front of full Board

HEAT INDUCED ILLNESSES

Heat Exhaustion & Heat Stroke

Symptoms

Heat Exhaustion

- Headaches
- Dizziness or lightheadedness
- Weakness
- Mood changes such as irritability
- Confusion or the inability to think straight
- Upset stomach—vomiting
- Fainting or passing out
- Pale, clammy skin

Heat Stroke

- Dry, pale skin with no sweating
- Hot, red skin that looks sunburned
- Mood changes such as irritability
- Confusion or the inability to think straight
- Seizures or fits
- Unconsciousness with no response

What You Can Do

- Learn the signs and symptoms of heat-induced illnesses
- Build up tolerance to heat and work activity slowly
- Drink plenty of cool water, about a cup every 15 to 20 minutes
- Wear loose fitting clothing
- Take frequent, short breaks in cool, shaded areas
- Avoid eating large meals in hot environments
- Avoid alcohol or beverages with caffeine
- Have workers trained about heat-induced illnesses

Veteran of the Month September 2019

Willie Elbert Dyson



The Tipton County Museum Veteran of the Month for September 2019 is Willie Elbert Dyson, who was born in Covington, Tennessee, in 1960. After graduating from Covington High School in 1978, he moved to Michigan to live with his sister and attend community college. His love of Country and a strong feeling of patriotism, however, soon overwhelmed him; and he felt the need to serve his country. In September of 1979 he enlisted in the United States Army and attended basic training in Fort Dix, New Jersey, followed by additional schooling in Aberdeen, Maryland. He spent a year and a half in Fort Stewart, Georgia, as a Track Wheel Vehicle Mechanic. He then transferred to D Company, 122nd Maintenance Battalion, US Army Europe in Butzbach, West Germany, where he worked as a Battery Shop Operator, a Generator Mechanic, and a Forward Support Track Wheel Mechanic for the next three years. In November of 1984 he was Honorably Discharged as an E-4 promotable. For his service to our country he was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, and M-16 Marksman Rifle badge.

With Army life behind him, he was now ready to begin a new chapter in his life. He returned home to Covington, where he began a fruitful career with Delfield on February 6, 1985. He is currently a Line Facilitator there, although he has worked in many areas of the plant over the years.

In addition to serving his country, Willie has been serving the Lord for many years. While stationed in Germany, he was blessed to pastor a local church there. For the past 26 years he has been pastor of Pilgrim Rest Baptist Church in Henning, Tennessee. Family is very important to him, and he is grateful to have both his daughters, Cassandra Dyson and Chandra Dyson Somerville, each having 2 children, living nearby in Covington.

Willie was nominated for Veteran of the Month by his good friend and May 2015 Veteran of the Month, John McBride.



Who Qualifies for the Tennessee Behavioral Health Safety Net Program

The Behavioral Health Safety Net Program is funded by the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and designed for adults with no health coverage and who meet certain criteria

Currently funds are available to provide mental health and substance abuse services for adults ages 18 and older who meet the following criteria:

- Do not have TENNCARE or other health coverage
- Be a US Citizen
- Be a resident of Tennessee
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have a household income at or below 138% of the Federal Poverty Level:
 - Single Adult less than \$17,236 per year
 - A family of 2 making less than \$23,336 per year
 - A family of three making less than \$29,435 all qualify




