Finance and Administration Committee Meeting - 9/17/19 - 4:00 p.m.

AMI Metering System

- Tracy Fearnley gave quick overview of system as presented to the Public Works Committee
 - Asset Management Program with Preventative and Corrective Maintenance
- Showed examples of manual-read water meter compared to smart water meter
- 100% warranty for 15 years, 20 years on network
- Recommending ACLARA Star AMI System
- Covers water and gas
- FCC Licensed
- Submitted Cost Justification, Annual Financial Benefit of \$516,165 per year
- Can spread cost over 5, 7, or 10 years
- Delay billing for one year from date of contract
- David Gray stated that he understands that this is an expensive proposition, but it would streamline customer service, maintenance, etc.
- Nic explained network architecture and the way the data is transmitted. This design is far superior to other systems, in his opinion.
- David Gray recommends 5 year plan
- Reflected in municipal fund balance in year 2021
- Alderman Wallace asked about how savings would be reflected
 - Per David, we have 2 meter readers, 2 trucks. It will take a year to implement system. We will continue to read meters during this time.
 - Meter readers would eventually be moved into other positions so no positions are lost
- Motioned made by Alderman Sullivan to recommend to Board to proceed, 2nd by Alderwoman Bommer, approved
- Will go to full Board on September 24th

Moratorium and Design Review Commission Discussion

- Per Lessie Fisher, City officials have received calls re: Hwy 51 corridor. Planning Commission has decided to update zoning.
- Per Attorney Witherington, Planning Commission voted in August to recommend to the Board of Mayor and Alderman that they pass a partial temporary moratorium for 6 months for parcels along Hwy 51. Current zoning is very broad, and the zoning districts are irregular. Have looked at other towns' zoning and uses permitted. Reason for moratorium is to temporarily halt building along Hwy 51 corridor while zoning change process, which is a lengthy
- This does not stop a new business from coming in to an existing building, just developing a new lot, rezoning a parcel.
- Any application or site plan that has already been approved with not be affected.
- Alderman Sullivan stated that this is a continuation of our strategic planning.

Finance and Administration Committee Meeting - 9/17/19 Cont'd

- Alderman Morris stated that he is concerned about a moratorium. Some property owners may have someone who has an interest, and this may keep them from making a decision.
- Per Alderman Sullivan this will tighten up aesthetics
- Citizen Harold Morris stated that he feels like Codes Department needs the funds and tools to do what it needs to do. Also, if this moratorium is put in place, this hinders citizens like him from making a living selling lots to incoming businesses.
- Alderwoman Yarbrough wanted clarification on the reason for hesitation. Alderman Wallace stated that he feels like we are causing more red tape for incoming business.
- Mayor Hanson asked if there is another way to go about this to address it in a way that allows for progress to a certain point. Attorney Witherington stated that generally, yes, there is a way to address it without a moratorium. The problem with making changes without a moratorium can create a change in zoning during the process, which could cause major issues for new businesses.
- Alderman Wallace suggested that the Codes Department review fewer items instead of the all ordinances at once, not imposing a moratorium
- Lessie Fisher discussed similar issues in other municipalities. We all want the city to look better and prosper. Looking at strategic plan, citizen concerns, this is something we need to do.
- Lauren Fletcher (Chamber) and Harold Morris spoke on barometer of what they are hearing about Hwy 51 corridor
- Alderman Wallace asked if we can make changes without moratorium. Attorney Witherington said we do not have to have a moratorium to make changes.
- Per Attorney Witherington, biggest risk is that there could be a rush to file applications under existing regulations before changes are made.
- Alderman Wallace stated that he is favorable to cleaning up Hwy 51 corridor but is not favorable to putting a moratorium in place and forming another review committee.
- Attorney Witherington gave the committee information about forming a Design Review Commission that would create guidelines for the exterior appearance of nonresidential property, multifamily residential property, and any entrance to a nonresidential development within the municipality. Planning Commission can be designated as the Design Review Commission or a separate commission can be created.
- Per Attorney Witherington, there would be a Design Review manual for non-residential development, separate from zoning ordinance.
- Planning commission must go by zoning ordinances
- Per Attorney Witherington, zoning changes take time and the effects are far reaching
- Per Alderman Sullivan, we must get this right. But we don't want to lose new business coming in.
- No decision was made regarding this

Delinquent Tax Sale – September 20, 2019

- 410 N. Maple St., minimum bid \$3,000, City would only have to pay county taxes owed on the property for 2016 and 2017
- Alderman Sullivan made motion for city to bid the property into Chancery Court if it does not sell at the delinquent property tax sale on 9/20, Alderman Wallace 2nd, approved

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned

Last week, Tennessee Gov. 


