Employees in this position work under the direct supervision of a Chief Operator, are uncertified and in training to become licensed operators of Water Treatment Facilities and Wastewater Treatment Facilities. Employees in the position will be provided adequate training for eligibility to acquire State of Tennessee Operators License's for Water and Wastewater Treatment.







(CITY), Tenn. – The Tipton County Health Department is offering flu vaccines at no charge to the community during a special "**FightFluTN**" vaccination event November 19.

"Getting a flu vaccine is the best way to protect yourself, your family and others from the flu and help keep our community healthy," said Tipton County Health Department Interim Director Christie Morris. "The flu can make you very sick, keep you away from work, school and other activities, put you in the hospital or even take your life. We urge everyone in Tipton County who has not received a flu shot yet to get one now, and this event is a great time to do it."

The Tipton County Health Department will provide flu shots November 19 at no cost to anyone who wishes to receive one at Tipton County Health Department from 9:30 to 12:30.

Seasonal influenza activity is spreading in Tipton County and across Tennessee and is expected to continue for months, so it's important for anyone over six months of age who hasn't had a flu shot this flu season to get one now. The flu vaccine is especially important for infants, young children, pregnant women, adults over age 50 and those with chronic medical conditions. The flu shot remains the best protection against influenza.

Washington St. Please be prepared to wait.

If your total income is less than \$17505 (single) or \$23595 (married), you may qualify for extra help with your drug costs. If you think you may qualify, bring proof of income & bank statements with you.

Staff *will not* be available on a daily basis for enrollment appointments as in years past.



This information is designed to help citizens of Tipton County to understand the importance of participating in the 2020 Census by completing and submitting the questionnaire. Every municipality and the County are committed to ensuring that all individuals living in Tipton County on April 1, 2020, are counted in the Census. Our ultimate goal is to ensure that in Tipton County, we:

COUNT EVERYONE ONCE, ONLY ONCE, AND IN THE RIGHT PLACE.



Each year, the Federal Government distributes \$675 billion dollars in federal funds based on an area's population per the Census count. Our county will receive money to support school lunches, housing, food stamps, all manner of grants, and many other programs based on the Census. The 2020 Census will be the basis of these distributions for the next ten years. Our Constitution requires that all residents of the United States are to be counted in the Census every ten years.



The Census Count is used to determine how many representatives our district has in Congress, and can also potentially affect your county district representation.



Historically, the under-counted persons who did not participate in the Census were children under the age of five, immigrants, and people with a lower income.



A complete and accurate Census is paramount to equity, opportunity, and addressing the many issues faced by our region and the nation.

Here they can also find information on courses available and programs of study including Computer Information Systems, Health Information Management, Early Childhood, Engineering Systems Technology, Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT), Nursing, Paramedic and Paramedic to RN Fast Track. More programs of study can be found at www.dsc.edu. Also available are 27 Tennessee Transfer Pathways (TTP) programs such as Agriculture, Business, History, Criminal Justice, Psychology, Pre-Physical Therapy and Pre-Occupational Therapy. TTP programs allow students to save money on tuition by taking the first two years at DSCC and then easily transferring to a four-year university or college in Tennessee to obtain a bachelor's degree.
