Personnel

As of the time of this report we have three (3) open LE positions. We have interviewed two (2) P.O.S.T. Certified Officers and have one (1) MS. P.O.S.T. Certified left to interview. There are five (5) non-certified officer that will begin the hiring process, this week. We hope to have the remaining positions filled by the end of July.

MPD and T.L.E.T.A. both have classed starting in August, if we choose to hire any of the non-certified officers.

Promotional Process

The Assessment Center for the Sergeants promotion was postponed due to several unforeseen conflicts involving the Candidates. The new date is unknown at this time but will be within two weeks of the date of this report.

The Candidates have been given their instructional guide for the written test and we have ordered the reference materials they will need to prepare for the write test. We hope to have the testing completed and a final ranking list by mid-July.

Training

We have two (2) officer who attend Instructor Developmental School last week at the Germantown Police Department, at no cost to the City. Both are scheduled to attend Firearms Instructor School later this year. Additional officers will also be given the opportunity to attend other training as they become available.

Grants

I have identified three (3) grants that I would like approval of the committee to move forward with. All three are 100% funded by the C.O.P.s Office, Community Policing Development (CPD) with zero matching funds required by the City.

New Public Crime Map

The Covington Police Department and LexisNexis Risk Solutions, recently partnered to provide a new way for the public to stay informed about crime in Covington. The Department now has an online crime map called Community Crime Map (<http://communitycrimemap.com/>) that maps and analyzes crime data, alerts Covington citizens about crimes in their area and allows the Department to quickly alert the public about crimes as they occur.

Covington citizens can view a map and grid with all the crimes in their area, sign up for neighborhood watch reports that automatically email a breakdown of recent crime activity, and submit an anonymous tip about a crime directly to their law enforcement agency. Community Crime Map automatically syncs with the Department's records system to keep crime information updated online and in the mobile app. Community Crime Map cleans and geocodes the crime data, then displays all of the incidents on a map, grid and analytics dashboard along with some basic information about the incidents, including the type of crime, location type, block-level address, date and time.

This is another way the Department is utilizing, cost free technology, to improve communication and awareness for our Citizens.

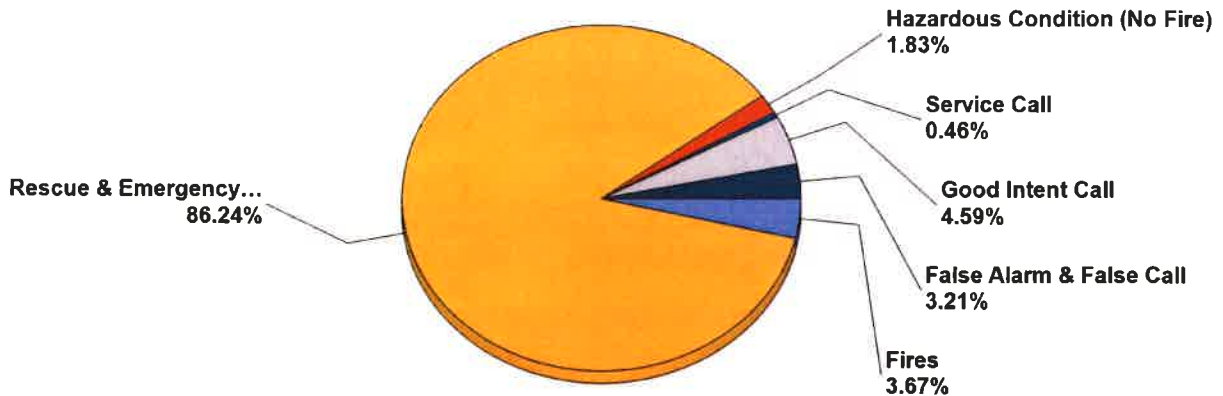

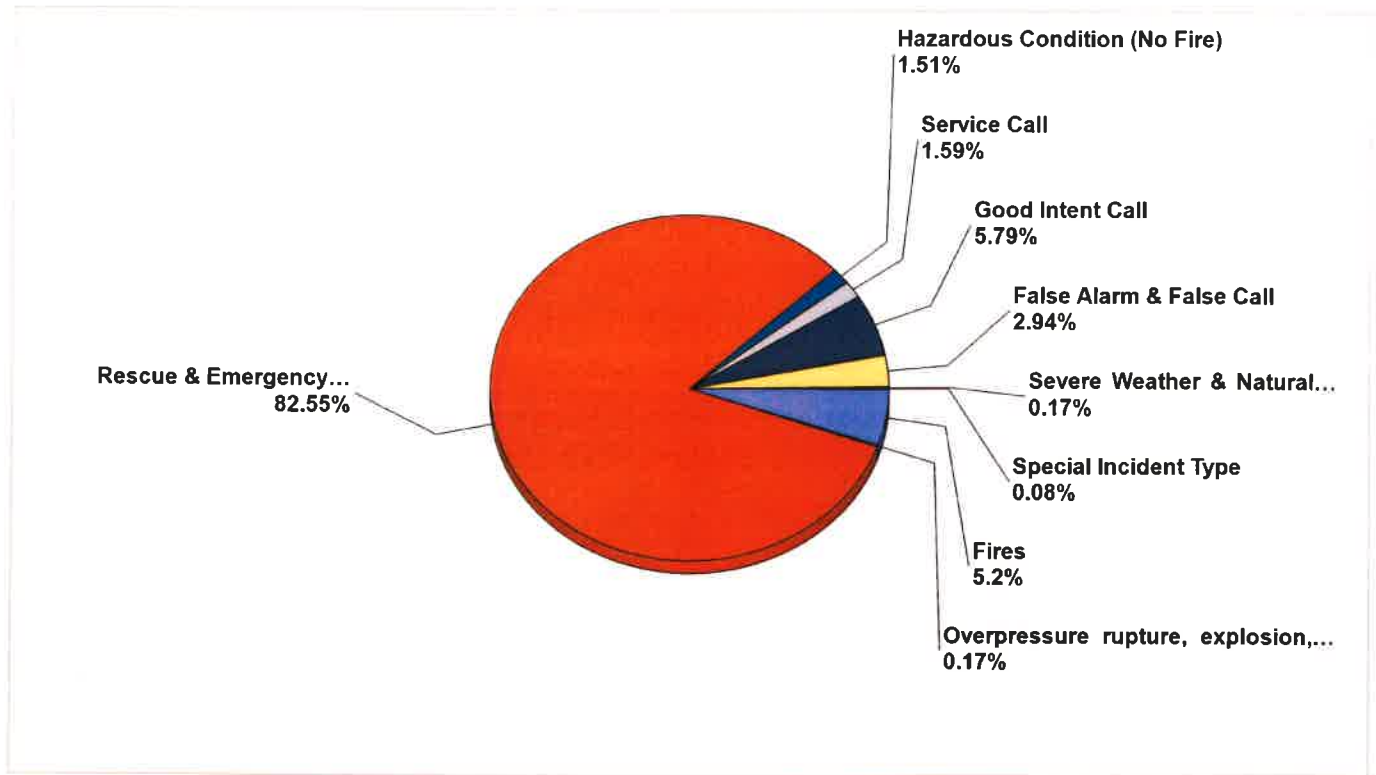
