Public Works Committee Meeting - 10/5/21

Public Works Report - Director David Gray

Director David Gray gave update on the street paving job. Steve Hight, Union City Paving, reported the roads have been completed under the contractual agreement. Areas of concern are being addressed. Some of the streets that need additional work are College St., Indian Wells, and Torrey Pines. The intersection at Sherrod and College will also be completed by the end of the week. Once the repairs are complete, Union City Paving will stop paving in the city to complete another contract job. They will be returning in November or early spring to complete the additional streets included in an amended contract.

Director Gray reported he has contacted Republic Services to discuss the sanitation contract. Republic will research to determine if better pricing can be reached. This information will be provided at the committee meeting in October.

The primary portion of the field audit for the LED project is complete. This moves us into the Data Reconciliation Design Stage.

Quotes for the upgrades to the main gate regulator station and the regulator station at Mueller Brass Road and Hwy 179 were presented. The upgrade to the main gate regulator station will cost \$64,000, however this will be reimbursed by Texas Gas. The cost for the upgrades at the Bruce Regulator Station and the First Treatment Plant has made repairs for electrical issues.

Preliminary audit numbers were presented showing net gains in the water (\$667,000), sewer (\$238,000), and sanitation (\$136,000) funds. The gas fund will have an approximate loss of \$96,000.

Motion was made by Alderman Morris and seconded by Alderwoman Yarbrough to accept report. Motion passed.

Codes Department Report - Director Lessie Fisher



SEA OF BLUE HONORING DETECTIVE MARIO HALL



It was an honor to join the families of Paula Croom Robinson and Judy Spray at the renaming of the Henning, Tennessee Post Office. Nearly eleven years ago, on October 18, 2010, Post Office Sales and Service Associate Robinson and Rural Carrier Spray were murdered during an attempted robbery at the post office. A commemorative plaque was unveiled honoring the memory of these two precious ladies. Robinson, a Covington resident, and Spray, a Lauderdale County resident, were longtime employees of the post office. Congressman David Kustoff sponsored the legislation that allowed the renaming. The Robinson and Spray families continue to remain in our thoughts and prayers.



Please join the Tipton County Museum and the Tipton County Veterans Council on Tuesday, Oct. 12 at 6:30pm as we honor our October Veteran of the Month Mr. Edward Odell Kinney. Born in Brighton, Tenn., on March 27, 1932, Edward Odell Kinney grew up working on the family farm. A typical farm boy, Odell left school after the seventh grade to dedicate himself full-time to farming. At 17, a unique earnings opportunity presented itself when he was hired to help construct a new Dupont Company plant in the Woodstock area between Millington and Memphis. Construction work is normally seasonal; so, when the work slowed in the winter, he attempted to join the Army. Too young to join without parental consent, Odell had to wait until after his 18th birthday to become a soldier and to begin his travels to parts of the world that he could only have dreamed of. After being



processed into the U.S. Army at Camp Breckenridge, Ky., Odell received his basic training at Camp Pickett, Va. His first set of orders was to the 23rd Tank Battalion at Camp Stoneville, Calif. It was not long until he found himself aboard a troop transport ship with 1,800 other military personnel headed west out of San Francisco Bay bound for Osaka, Japan. The Korean War was in full swing, and Odell was itching to join the fight. He transferred to the 2nd Infantry Division and volunteered to fight on the frontlines. Areas near Old Baldy and Pork Chop Hill were two of the well-known locations where Squad Leader Kinney led his men into battle. After nine months of rotating on and off frontline duty, he was transferred stateside to San Francisco for duty in the Honor Guard. Not only did he get to serve in parade details honoring his fellow service personnel who were returning from overseas, but he also earned the distinct privilege of serving in the parade detail that honored General Douglas McArthur when he returned to the United States. Odell remained in the honor guard until receiving his honorable discharge on January



29, 1954. For his service to our great Nation, he was awarded the United Nations Service Medal, Combat Infantry Badge, and Korean Service Medal with one Bronze Campaign Star. Following his military service, Odell returned to Tipton County and settled near the family farm at Pisgah. The Chromasco Company in Woodstock soon hired him to work in their maintenance department. It was not long after that that he met and married a beautiful lady from the Oak Grove Community, Miss Nancy Walton. They eventually purchased the Kinney family farm from his father where they raised five children during their 60 years of marriage. Mr. Kinney was nominated for Veteran of the Month by David Quinn, the February 2019 Veteran of the Month.






