Public Works Report - Director David Gray

Director Gray gave an update on street paving. It may be about 3 weeks until completion.

Information was submitted regarding the TN Department of Transportation Road Safety Audit and the proposed roundabout at S. College St. and Mueller Brass Rd. Also included in the audit was information regarding signage and new paving projects.

The PATH LED lighting kick-off meeting was held August 30th. The start date will be September 14th and target end date is October 1st. An authorization letter was submitted and information was discussed regarding public notification and vehicle signage.






