#### **General Welfare / Public Relations Committee - 8/10/21**

Chairman Alderman Morris called meeting to order.

Due to Airport Manager Robin Anderson absence, Mayor Hanson gave report for the airport. He reported July fuel sales of 13,196 gallons. The security upgrades are in process. The ACIP has been updated. The annual inspection has been completed and new license issued.

Motion was made by Alderman C H Sullivan and seconded by Mayor Justin Hanson to accept the airport report. Motion passed.

Fitness Coordinator Whitney Wallace gave an update on the park maintenance projects approved in the previous budget year. The timers on the tennis court lights have been installed. The old soccer goals at Frazier Park have been removed. Deposits have been paid to resurface the basketball and tennis courts. Donations have been received from Baptist Memorial Hospital, Cold Storage, and Unilever to assist with the cost to resurface Frazier Basketball Court. The security system at Frazier Park is in the process of being installed. The special events committee meeting minutes were presented.

Motion was made by Mayor Justin Hanson and seconded by Alderman C H Sullivan to accept the park and recreation report. Motion passed.

Museum Director Kathryn Markley reported the veteran of the month is John Abbott and will be recognized on August 10, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. The museum had 520 visitors for the month. The front entrance and left ease overhangs have been rebuilt along with the cleaning of the gutters. The gift shop has been remodeled. Upcoming events include Cars & Coffee, National Dog Event, Paula Sweat Rock Painting Class, Natural Journaling Classes, and the Garden Series.

Motion was made by Mayor Hanson and seconded by Alderman Sullivan to accept the report from Museum Director Markley. Motion passed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:29 p.m.



### Finance and Administration Committee - 8/17/21

Parks and Recreation Director Glass began the discussion on the Frazier Alumni Center Roof. A presentation was given to show the damages to the roof and the building. The roof repair is estimated to be \$70,000.00 which includes gutters and siding.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Morris to proceed with the request for proposal for the Frazier Alumni Center roof amending the budget to include the estimated cost of \$70,000.00. Alderman Wallace requested the RFP to include alternative repairs if total roof repair is not necessary. Motion passed.

Police Chief Lindsey gave an overview on crime statistics. The crime solve rate is at 53.65% which is above the estimated TN rate of 39.36%. Total offenses showed a 26.6% decline from 785 to 586. Year to date, there have been a total of 501 arrests. Crime is down 37.61%. Five additional cameras will be installed.

Building Official Fisher began discussion on proposed updates to Code Chapter 8 (Alcoholic Beverages). She has gathered information from the MTAS website and will forward to committee members. If the committee has any proposed changes, they will need to contact Attorney Witherington or Director Fisher

### **Covington Police Department Report - Sgt. Tony Ginn**

Personnel report states that 3 conditional offers have been extended to fill remaining open positions. Start date would be August 30th. All officers are non certified and will start TN Law Enforcement Training Academy on October 4th.

Promotional process is complete. Ofc. Billy Campbell has been promoted to sergeant. Sgt Campbell will spend two weeks with each sergeant on their assigned shift as part of training and attend Firstline Supervisory School at the end of the month. There are now 5 sergeants in the department.

Captain Howell is continuing training at Southeastern Command Leadership School. Detective Doss is attending Criminal Investigations School this week and Lr. McCurry and Det. Dowell just returned from a Homicide Conference.

Fleet Report - PL03 damaged when struck by a fleeing subject has been repaired and put back in service. PL06 which was totaled in July needs to be replaced and PL41 has also been deemed a total loss and needs to be replaced. The used parts from theses vehicles plus 2 insurance payments will replace one vehicle. Still need \$35,000 to replace other vehicle. Alderman Sullivan made motion to send this issue to Finance and Administration Committee, Alderman Richardson 2nd, so moved.

Alderman Sullivan motioned to accept report, Mayor Hanson 2nd, report accepted.

### **Covington Fire Department Report - Chief Richard Griggs**

Chief Griggs invited Committee members to the ISO (Insurance Service Organization) Public Classification in Dyersburg on 9/28.

There were 15 volunteer hours worked in the month of June. Total calls July 23-August 19 were 209 with 1662 for the year. Calls are up by 400 and the increase is mostly COVID related.

County coverage area collections for 2021 is \$82,840.

The fire department is fully staffed. New firefighters Ginn and Moore will start the Madison County 10-week recruit training class and Firefighter Smith will attend skills sessions to include automobile extrication.. Cpt. Travis, Lt. Dunavant, and Lt. Ruffin attending International Arson Conference in Gatlinburg August 23-27.

### **CARE Report Submitted**


Tanker 1, which was recalled, is repaired and back in service.

Mayor Hanson moved to accept report, Alderman Richardson 2nd, report accepted.







In commemoration of Alex Haley's 100th birthday, we gathered last week with his grandson and others in celebration! Former Tennessee Governor and US Senator Lamar Alexander flew into Covington's airport and served as the keynote speaker at the event! Mayor Hanson joined Ripley Mayor Craig Fitzhugh and Henning Mayor Baris Douglas in presenting Alex Haley Museum Director Richard Griffin a proclamation in celebration of Alex Haley's life and legacy.





Congratulations to our Tipton County Museum August Veteran of the Month John Abbott. John Durwood Abbott was born November 4, 1922, in Wesson, Arkansas, the only child of Henry C. and Carrie May Abbott. John left school after the 7th grade to work on tugboats towing barges from Houston, Texas, to Mobile, Alabama. He joined the maritime services in early 1945 and was assigned to the Tosetalle, a T-2 fuel tanker, where he spent much of his time as helmsman. His ship crossed the Pacific Ocean, avoiding mines and at least one Japanese submarine. In August 1945, they were 800 mines off the coast of Okinawa when "the bomb" was dropped. He received his honorable discharge in September and immediately joined the U.S. Army. After boot camp at Camp Stoneman, Calif., he boarded a transport ship headed to Iwo Jima by way of Guam and Saipan, where he served for a year overseas. He received his honorable discharge in July 1947 and was awarded the World War II Victory Medal and lapel button for his time in the Army. John returned to the midsouth and attended Hemp Hill Diesel School in Memphis, intending to bolster the knowledge he had obtained during his time in the service. After his marriage in 1948 to Janie Reamonia Millican, his plans changed. To pursue his interest in horology (the study and measurement of time), he moved his family to Farmerville, La., to do on-the-job-training under two of his cousins who were watchmakers and jewelers.

John opened his first jewelry store in Camden, Ark., where he also worked part-time as a security guard at a local ordinance plant. Once he moved his family and business to Gurdin, Ark., his business flourished. He attracted the attention of the men who worked for the Missouri-Pacific Railroad and quickly became the official watch inspector for the railroad. He eventually was the only person allowed to work on watches for the railroad workers. About 1952, he unrooted everything and moved to Millington, Tennessee, where he opened a jewelry shop on Navy Road and did a booming business for almost 20 years. He eventually opened a small shop in Munford, and another in

Frayser. Ready for a change, he closed his stores in the early 1970's and moved his family to Australia. He quickly found work in horology there; but after a couple of years, it was time to return home. He reopened his businesses in Millington and Frayser with his wife as a bookkeeper. Her death in 2010 irrevocably changed things, and in 2018 he decided it was time to retire. He spends his days working around his house and property in Drummonds and can usually be found tinkering in his garage or cutting his yard. He is a member of the Tipton County Veterans Council and American Legion Post 237. John was nominated for Veteran of the Month by Kathy Desjarlais.
