On the third and final reading Tuesday night, June 22nd, Mayor Hanson presented his proposed 2021-2022 budget to the Covington Board of Aldermen. The budget passed with a 5-1 vote. This is Mayor Hanson's seventh budget presented and passed on time and balanced. This is also the seventh budget presented without an increase in the tax rate. In fact, our municipal tax rate has decreased from \$1.33/\$100 assessed value to \$1.24/\$100 assessed value. Included in this budget are three new firefighters, additional police cameras to further improve public safety, money to continue blight eradication, investment to further improve our utilities and utility service, a new sidearm mower, investment for playground and field improvements in parks and recreation, new public works equipment, and new firefighter turnout gear. Also implemented in this budget is the first of a five-year salary study employee compensation plan that makes certain our team members are paid according to industry standards.









On Tuesday, June 22nd, the City of Covington had the honor of hosting recent Tipton-Rosemark Academy graduate Seth Walker as a job shadow. Mr. Walker was immersed in all aspects of city government, from utilities to public safety and parks and recreation! Special thanks to the Covington Police Department, Covington Fire Department, Covington Codes Dept, Covington Public Works Covington Parks & Recreation, Covington Aquatic Center, and the Tipton County Museum for your hospitality. Mr. Walker also attended the Public Safety Committee and Board of Mayor and Alderman meeting. Seth is an incoming freshman at the University of Memphis.



Covington's economy continues to thrive and remain strong! We've just received our local option sales tax collection report from the month of April. Our sales tax revenue continues on an upward trajectory. Month-to-date sales are up 16.3% (\$57,815) and year-to-date sales are up 14.4% (\$463,710). 


