Finance and Administration Committee Meeting - 9/15/20

Discussion on City of Covington Code/Charter – Department Head Dismissal

- Need to make the process uniform
- Alderman Phelps stated that the Mayor needs to make recommendation on hiring and firing and the Board approves, put in form of a motion, 2nd, discussion
 - o Ratification is established in language in the charter
 - Language becomes more concrete in Charter, more permanent
 - Roll call, motion carries


Discussion on sale of city property – East Pleasant & N. Main St.

- Director Mack discussed with Kelvyn Thomas and he is considering purchase or lease of the N.
 Main building.
- Any sale contract needs to include language that the City has use of the restrooms
- Alderman Phelps is not sure that language can be put into a sales contract
- Kelvyn and Lisa Thomas joined meeting and are interested in obtaining building, but they are concerned about the restroom issue. The Thomases would want to purchase and not lease
- Discussed tax appraisal of approximately \$15,000
- This discussion is going to be tabled until October
- Motion was made to sell property and give Thomases first right of refusal, 2nd, discussion, Alderman Phelps cannot support motion until we resolve the restroom issue, roll call, 2 ayes, 4 nays, motion does not pass.
- Motion made to pursue selling property to parties that show interest, and finding a solution to restroom issue, 2nd, roll call, 5 ayes, 1 nay, motion passes
- Chairman Sullivan asked the Thomases to bring back a figure to the October meeting
- Discussed East Pleasant and how to go about selling
- Director Fisher stated that there has to be some inspections and repairs before we can move forward with sale
- Motion made to move ahead with sale of E. Pleasant property and getting Requests for Proposals to realtors, 2nd, discussion, roll call, so moved.

Contract for venture Auctions – for approval

- Regarding the sale of surplus property, not real estate
- Director Dunn contacted MTAS (Municipal Technical Advisory Service) and they stated that we need to get a contract approved for the new auction company
- Discussed using local company versus govdeals.com
- Motion made to accept contract from Venture Auctions, 2nd, discussion, roll call, so moved

There being no further business, meeting adjourned


COVID DRIVE-THRU TESTING TIMES HAVE CHANGED! Monday-Friday, 8:00am-Noon

After discussions with County Executive Jeff Huffman as well as updated recommendations from the Health Department, LeBonheur, and the UT HSC, Tipton County Board of Education agrees that a mandatory mask requirement is the appropriate next step to slow the spread of COVID-19. Our hope is that the mask requirement and other safety protocols such as social distancing will help keep schools open for learning.






