Public Works Report – Director David Gray

Republic sanitation discussion – Republic Manager Gerry Burke

- Mr. Gerry Burke addressed the committee, he realizes there are currently issues on residential service but believes things are moving in the right direction
- Republic has had issues with COVID-19 and a shortage of employees
- Working on changes with personnel, routing, carts
- Alderman Wallace thanked Mr. Burke for participating in this meeting. Addressed communication issue and felt like communication and service had improved
- Chairman Morris stated that it is good to be able to respond to constituents positively about changes that are being put in place

Level Billing Discussion

- We have contacted Covington Electric to see how they handle level billing. Also contacted Local Government. Process is complicated but working to get enough information to implement
- Would like to further investigate and bring back to this committee in October
- Alderwoman Bommer asked for clarity between budget billing and level billing
 - Budget billing, customer pays the same every month
 - Level billing, customer pays different amount every month
- Senior Accountant Kristin Mathis explained how budget billing was calculated
- Committee discussed how to deal with credits on accounts and how to return that to customers

Rialto Water Main Replacement with SDG (Site Development Grant)

- Open bids last Thursday
- Low bidder was Rose Construction
- Motion made to accept bid from Rose Construction, 2nd, roll call, so moved

Request for Speed Humps on Erwin Lane

- Have put up Slow Children at Play signs and moved speed sign
- Will collect data and get to police department

- Committee would like data at next meeting


COVID DRIVE-THRU TESTING TIMES HAVE CHANGED! Monday-Friday, 8:00am-Noon



The drive-up COVID-19 testing site at the Tipton County Health Department will be giving FREE tests Monday - Friday, **8:00 a.m.-Noon.** The Tennessee National Guard is on hand to administer the tests. You can drive through and get your free test regardless of symptoms. Tipton County Health Department is located at 4700 Mueller Brass Rd.



Tipton County Executive Jeff Huffman has announced, per the authority granted to county mayors by Gov. Bill Lee, a mask mandate for Tipton County that began on August 4th and will continue through 11:59 pm Wednesday, September 30th. To read the complete order, CLICK HERE.



Masks Required at Tipton County Schools

After discussions with County Executive Jeff Huffman as well as updated recommendations from the Health Department, LeBonheur, and the UT HSC, Tipton County Board of Education agrees that a mandatory mask requirement is the appropriate next step to slow the spread of COVID-19. Our hope is that the mask requirement and other safety protocols such as social distancing will help keep schools open for learning.



The Tennessee Pledge was developed by Governor Lee, the Unified Command Group (UCG) and Tennessee's Economic Recovery Group (ERG) with input from health experts, state and local partners and business and industry leaders. It includes specific recommendations which enable most businesses to reopen responsibly without the burden of heavy mandates. This will be a gradual process, with room to adjust as data is evaluated. The new CodeRED system, a high-speed emergency notification service provided by OnSolve, will allow administrators to communicate with residents and personnel by sending text messages, emails, posts to social media and mobile app messages to inform residents of emergencies and better protect life and property.

The service includes the CodeRED Weather Warning system, an automated weather warning technology that delivers text messages, and emails to registered residents and businesses within the direct path of severe weather. The CodeRED Weather Warning system is an opt-in service that automatically notifies those enrolled of tornado, flash flood, and severe thunderstorm warnings just moments after an alert is issued by the National Weather Service (NWS).

ALL residents living within Tipton County are encouraged to enroll by selecting the CodeRED logo below using their desktop, laptop or mobile device OR residents may also text 'TiptonTN' to 99411 from your mobile phone to receive the link to register and input your contact information.

2020 Census: Census Taker Visits

What Your Community Needs to Know

To ensure everyone is counted, census takers visit households that haven't responded yet to the 2020 Census to collect their responses in person.

Health and Safety

Census takers will follow public health guidelines when they visit.

Census takers are trained to:

- · Wear a mask.
- Conduct the interview outside a home in an open, well-ventilated space, when possible.
- Allow 6 feet of space between them and the person they are interviewing.
- Not allow anyone else to handle Census Bureau equipment.

 Follow healthy hygiene habits for frequent hand-washing, avoiding contact with hightouch surfaces, avoiding touching their face, etc.

If a household does not want to conduct the interview in person, they can provide the census taker with their phone number to complete it over the phone.

Confidentiality

By law:

- · Interviews are confidential.
- Answers cannot be shared with immigration or law enforcement agencies.
- Census takers must keep answers confidential for life. They face stiff fines and jail time if they break that law.
