On Sunday, June 14th, community members and first responders came together to bring awareness to social justice, police brutality, racism, and equality. The walk began at Peeler and Highway 51, traveled south on Highway 51 to Ripley, then Main Street to the Square. Once around the Square the group went to Sherrod Ave. down to Highway 51, north to West Ripley where they met at Frazier Park. There were tents available with volunteers to assist participants in voter registration, obtaining insurance, and expungement.














DAIRY DAY Monday June 29 3PM-6PM
