Public Safety Committee Meeting 6/28/2022, 4:00 p.m.

The General Welfare – Public Safety Committee met at City of Covington on June 28, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Justin Hanson, Alderman C H Sullivan, and Alderman Chris Richardson. Also, present were Police Chief Donna Turner, Fire Chief Richard Griggs, Alderman Danny Wallace, Alderman Jeff Morris, Public Works Director David Gray, Building Official Lessie Fisher, and Recorder-Treasurer Tina Dunn.

Mayor Hanson called meeting to order.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Richardson for Mayor Hanson to chair the meeting. Motion passed.

Police Chief Donna Turner reported the department currently has five vacant positions. An interview panel has been scheduled for July 7th. Officer VanVleet attended interdiction mastermind training through Street Cop. This course gives the officer a clear understanding of what it means to be an effective criminal interdiction officer. City Court Clerk Carolyn Scott attended the Court Clerks Conference. All fines will be brought up to \$50.00 in the Administrative Ordinance. One of the Dodge Chargers is having equipment installed this week and should be returned next week. The monthly activities were presented for review. The statistics for the month was presented showing 1484 calls for the month and 500 traffic stops.

Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Richardson to approve the police department report. Motion passed.

Fire Chief Richard Griggs reported CPR training was held on June 4th. CFD trained 10 individuals. There was a total of 50 individuals trained in all fire departments. There were 54 hours worked by the volunteers in May. The run report was presented showing 281 calls from May 19th to June 23rd. There has been a total of 1308 calls for the year. The county coverage area collections to date are \$82,030.00. Pat Harcourt is currently working with contractors about the door project at Station 2. All sirens are repaired and working at this time. The care and fire inspection reports were presented for review.


Motion was made by Alderman Sullivan and seconded by Alderman Richardson to approve the fire department report. Motion passed.




