The General Welfare – Public Relations Committee met at City of Covington on

Chairman Alderman Morris called meeting to order.

Airport Manager Anderson reported June fuel sales totaling 7,923 gallons. A report showing project updates was presented. The airport farmland rental lease will expire this year. The bid for this lease will be in October. Director Anderson will contact Barge Design concerning any updates to the airport layout plan due to Blue Oval City.

Food Truck Fridays have been extended to August 5th. There will be a pickleball camp on July 25th for ages over 13. Movie night at the Aquatic Center will be on July 29th. The special events committee meeting minutes were presented. The Chamber of Commerce will attend the Finance & Administration Committee Meeting to request the removal of fees for the Heritage Day Festival.




