5. Criminal Investigation Division (Det Dwayne Dowell – Atoka PD)

Training

- May 5-6, **Officer Alex VanVleet** attended training through Street Cop, Interdiction Mastermind

About the Course: - Intended to give the officer a clear understanding of what it means to be an effective criminal interdiction officer. The instructor will break down piece by piece the tactics and mindset utilized by proactive Interdiction officers. Upon completion of this course the officer will obtain a higher amount of knowledge, understanding and confidence, that will prove to be invaluable to your agency

- May 19th – 20th, **City Court Clerk Carolyn Scott** attended the Court Clerks Conference in Franklin TN.

About the course: During the conference there are several elements reviewed regarding fines, fees and reporting accurately to the Department of Safety any actions taken that can affect Driver's License history on all citations. We discussed actions taken by the Department of Safety after a submission is received. This is a valuable conference as it is educational and keeps staff informed of any changes that need to be made in reporting. It also allows court clerks to meet other clerks in the neighboring cities. We also have time to directly talk with the MTAS Specialist and their staff.

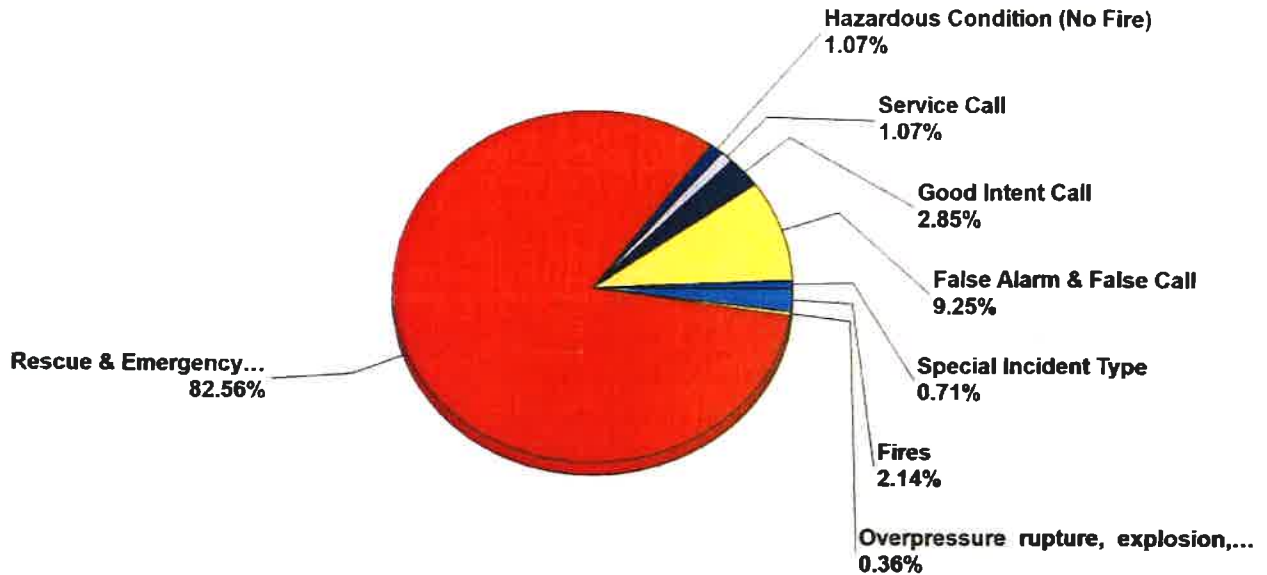

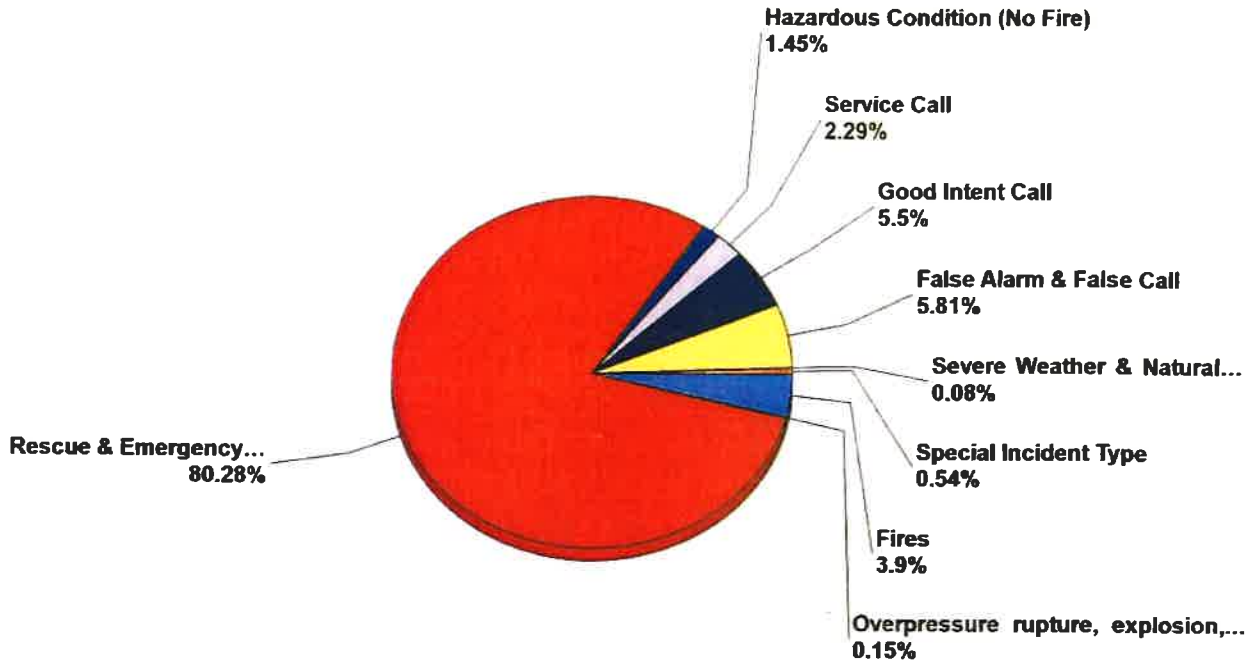
