Chief Turner reported Officer Gill resigned and Officer Woodard will be the new K-9 Officer handling Gino. Chief Turner reported 6 officers attended the 40-hour Crisis Intervention Program. (see attached) The major expenses for the police department were the Central Dispatch Service and User Fees, in the amount of \$74,812.80. Chief Turner reported a total of 57 arrests, 60 traffic stops and 5 parking tickets for the month of December. The police department received 1,363 calls in December, and a total of 17,822 calls for the year. Chief Turner announced the license plate reader sent in 16 arrests and 22 warning tickets. Chief Turner announced the grant update (see attached) for the SRO at the TCA. Alderman Edwards requested the funding for the SRO at TCA be discussed at the next Finance and Administration Committee Meeting.

Motion was made by Alderman Morris and seconded by Mayor Hensley to approve the report from Police Chief Donna Turner. Motion passed.

Public Works Director Tim Haynes gave an update to the Mobil Application for customers to pay and review bills. Director Haynes stated this was included in our service and will continue to process to have this implemented.

Covington Police File Charges in Duo Hit and Run Crashes.

On 06 December 2024, at approximately 3:30 p.m., Covington Police Department (CPD) officers responded to a reported hit-and-run collision at **Wendy's, located at 802 Hwy 51 North in Covington, TN**. Upon arrival, officers spoke with two victims who reported their vehicles had been struck by a gray SUV, later identified as a Buick Encore.

One of the victims stated that while in the drive-through, their vehicle was backed into by the gray SUV, resulting in damage to the passenger side doors. The suspect vehicle then fled the scene, driving over the curb into the neighboring parking lot of **China Star Restaurant at 806 Hwy 51 North**, where it struck a second vehicle. After causing damage to the second vehicle, the suspect vehicle fled the area, traveling northbound on Hwy 51. At the time of the report, the identity of the suspect driver remained unknown. Officers at the scene confirmed the drivers and the children in the vehicles were not injured in the crashes.

Later that evening, at approximately 9:00 p.m., officers located a vehicle matching the description, gray Buick Encore, at a residence in the 1400 block of Sandpiper Drive in Covington. Officers made contact with the registered vehicle's owner who claimed to have no knowledge of the vehicle's involvement in the incident. Officers were able to confirm the vehicle had visible damage matching the areas damaged in the crashes and confirmed the tag number from video footage. The vehicle was towed to the Covington Police Department seizure lot for further investigation.

On 09 December 2024, during the investigation, CPD Detectives reviewed surveillance footage from Wendy's, which clearly showed the driver of the suspect vehicle. The alleged driver of the Buick Encore was identified through the video surveillance as the registered owner, **Lavanderious Stanback**, 62, of the Sandpiper address.

Detectives re-interviewed Stanback, who initially denied being involved in the crashes, However, she acknowledged visiting Wendy's on the day of the incident.

As a result of the investigation, Stanback was taken into custody and charged with two counts of Vandalism and two counts of Leaving the Scene of an Accident. Stanback is free on a \$5,000.00 bond. She is slated to appear in General Sessions Court on December 13, 2024, at 9:00 a.m.

"We are fortunate no one was injured in the crashes on the parking lots which frequently have customers walking. Anyone involved in a crash is required to stop and report the incident." said Chief Donna Turner "Officers and Detectives were able to utilize technology to track the vehicle, confirm a timeline back to the suspect vehicle. Great police work in quickly locating the vehicle and driver in this case."


