MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Between the Covington Fire Department and Apartment Complex Property Managers Regarding Forced Entry and Liability for Non-Compliant Locking Systems

This Memorandum of Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into on the _____ day of March 2025 by and between the **City of Covington, Board of Mayor and Aldermen and the Covington Fire Department ("CFD"),** a municipal fire service provider located in Covington, Tennessee, and **BTT Development II, LP, a Tennessee Limited Partnership and owner/operator of Eaglewood VIII Apartments** located at 50 Eaglewood Dr., Covington, TN and more specifically described in Record Book 1781, Page 103 in the Register's Office of Tipton County, Tennessee ("Eaglewood").

RECITALS:

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Covington Fire Department (CFD) is responsible for providing fire suppression, emergency medical services, and other emergency response services to the residents and properties within its jurisdiction, including the properties owned and operated by Eaglewood.

<u>WHEREAS</u>, rapid access to all areas of multi-family residential buildings, including individual apartments, is critical for the safety of occupants and the effective performance of CFD's duties during emergencies, as required by the 2018 International Fire Code (IFC) Section 506 [Key Boxes] and the 2018 International Building Code (IBC) Section 403.5.4 [Emergency Responder Access].

<u>WHEREAS</u>, Eaglewood is responsible for maintaining locking systems and providing access mechanisms, such as master keys or "Knox Box" systems, to ensure CFD can gain entry to all areas of the property in an emergency without undue delay, in accordance with state law and applicable building and fire codes, including but not limited to T.C.A. § 68-120-101 *et seq.* and T.C.A. § 68-140-301 *et seq.*

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the current locking systems at Eaglewood are not fully compliant with master keying standards or "Knox Box" requirements, as the "Knox Box" system does not contain entry keys for every apartment, which could result in CFD forcing entry to gain access during emergencies.

<u>WHEREAS</u>, forced entry may result in damage to doors, door components, door jambs, windows, window components, window sashes, or other property.

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Parties wish to clarify their respective responsibilities and establish an agreement that CFD is not liable for any damage resulting from forced entry into any part(s) of Eaglewood necessary during an emergency due to the non-compliant locking systems.





NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Acknowledgment of Non-Compliant Locking Systems. Eaglewood acknowledges that the locking systems at Eaglewood VIII Apartments, as described more specifically hereinabove, are not fully compliant with master keying standards or "Knox Box" requirements as outlined in the 2018 International Fire Code (IFC) § 506.1, which mandates that buildings equipped with key boxes (e.g., Knox Boxes) provide keys for immediate access to all areas by emergency responders. Specifically, the "Knox Box" at Eaglewood does not contain entry keys for every apartment unit, contrary to best practices for emergency access.
- 2. Forced Entry in Emergencies. Eaglewood understands and agrees that, in the event of an emergency where CFD personnel are unable to gain access to an apartment or other area of the property using non-destructive means (e.g., master keys or Knox Box keys), CFD may need to perform a forced entry to protect life, safety, or property, as authorized under state law and the 2018 IFC § 104.11 [Authority of the Fire Code Official].
- 3. Non-Liability for Damages Due to Forced Entry. Eaglewood agrees that CFD, the City of Covington, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, and elected officials shall not be held liable for any damage to doors, door components, door jambs, windows, window components, window sashes, or any other property resulting from forced entry necessary during an emergency due to the non-compliant locking systems. This agreement aligns with state law, including TCA § 29-20-205 [Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act], which limits liability for governmental entities acting within their official duties, absent willful misconduct.
- 4. Eaglewood's Responsibility to Mitigate Risks. Eaglewood agrees to take reasonable steps to bring the property's locking systems into compliance with CFD requirements and applicable codes, including but not limited to:
 - a. Installing or updating a Knox Box system with keys providing access to all common areas and individual apartments pursuant to 2018 IFC § 506.1; or
 - b. Implementing a master key system compatible with CFD access protocols, as recommended by the 2018 IBC Section 403.5.4 for emergency responder access. The Property Manager acknowledges that failure to address these deficiencies may result in repeated forced entries and associated property damage.
- 5. Notification and Coordination. Eaglewood agrees to notify CFD upon achieving compliance with master keying and/or "Knox Box" requirements. CFD agrees to provide guidance or recommendations, if requested, to assist Eaglewood in achieving compliance with the 2018 IFC and 2018 IBC standards.





- 6. **Indemnification**. Eaglewood agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CFD, the City of Covington, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, and elected officials from any claims, damages, or liabilities arising out of or related to property damage caused by forced entry during an emergency due to non-compliant locking systems, except as may be defined by T.C.A. § 29-20-205.
- 7. **Term and Termination**. This Agreement shall remain in effect until terminated by either Party with thirty (30) days written notice or until eaglewood achieves full compliance with CFD access requirements as described herein, whichever occurs first.
- 8. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee and local ordinances of the City of Covington, Tennessee, including but not limited to provisions of the current adopted International Fire Code and International Building Code as adopted by the State of Tennessee and local ordinances.
- 9. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties and supersedes all prior agreements, whether written or oral, relating to the subject matter herein. Any amendments to this Agreement must be made in writing and signed by both Parties.
- 10. Notices. Any required notice under this Agreement shall be sent to the parties at the following addresses:

Covington Police Makes Arrest in Embezzlement Investigation

On 30 January 2025, the Covington Police Department received information of a possible embezzlement at **Fletcher's Auto located at 1830 Hwy 51 in Covington, TN**. CPD officers were advised by Casey Fletcher that according to his recent records someone had stolen approximately \$16,000.00 using his business credit card.

CPD Detectives obtained subpoenas for the business bank records and were able to identify **Mallorie Page, 30 of Shiloh Road in Covington, TN** as an alleged suspect. Detectives during the investigation confirmed Page was a former employee of the business. Detectives were able to track unapproved purchases through Door Dash and from Wal-Mart. The fraud was confirmed to have been occurring over the past two years.

On 25 February 2025, CPD Detectives conducted a search warrant in the 500 block of Shiloh Road in Covington. While on the scene, Detectives made contact with Mallorie Page who was detained and transported to the Covington Police Department Criminal Investigation Division. Detectives located multiple items related to the fraudulent charges at the residence. Page was cooperative with detectives during the investigation.

Page was transported to the Tipton County Jail and formally charged with Fraudulent Use of A Credit Card. Page is being held on a \$20,000.00 bond. She is slated to appear before Judge M.O. Eckel, III in Tipton County General Sessions Court later this week.

"I commend the great police work of the detectives to quickly identify the manner in which the theft was occurring and the potential suspect in the case." said **Chief Donna Turner** "We urge you to check your credit card and bank account activity regularly and report any suspicious activity. Rather it be theft of your identity or unauthorized approval by someone you know, both can be a tool to make unwanted charges, theft, and could harm your credit."
