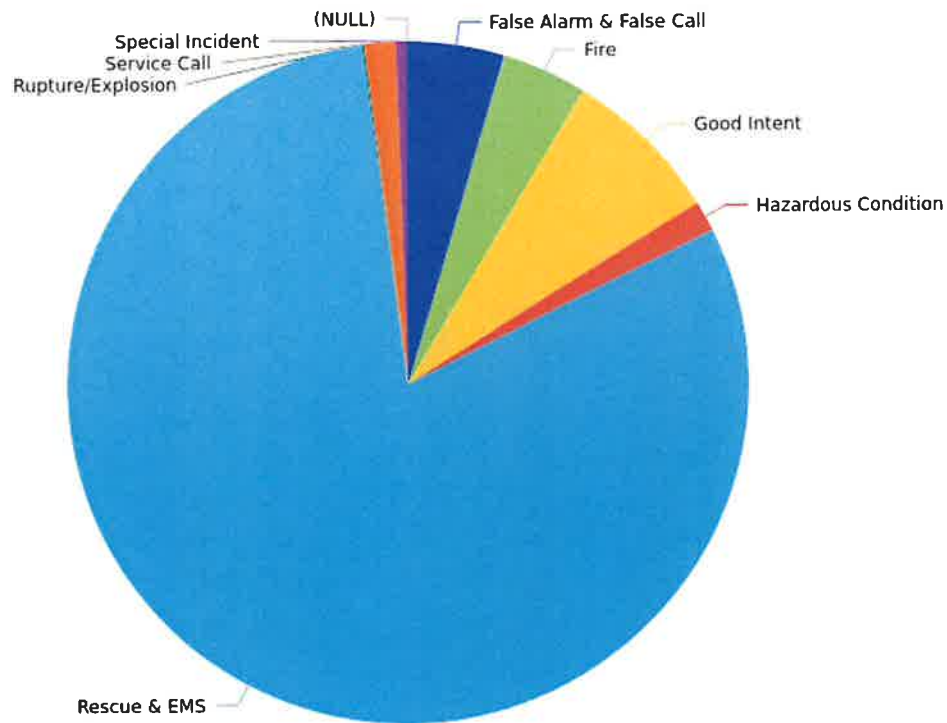

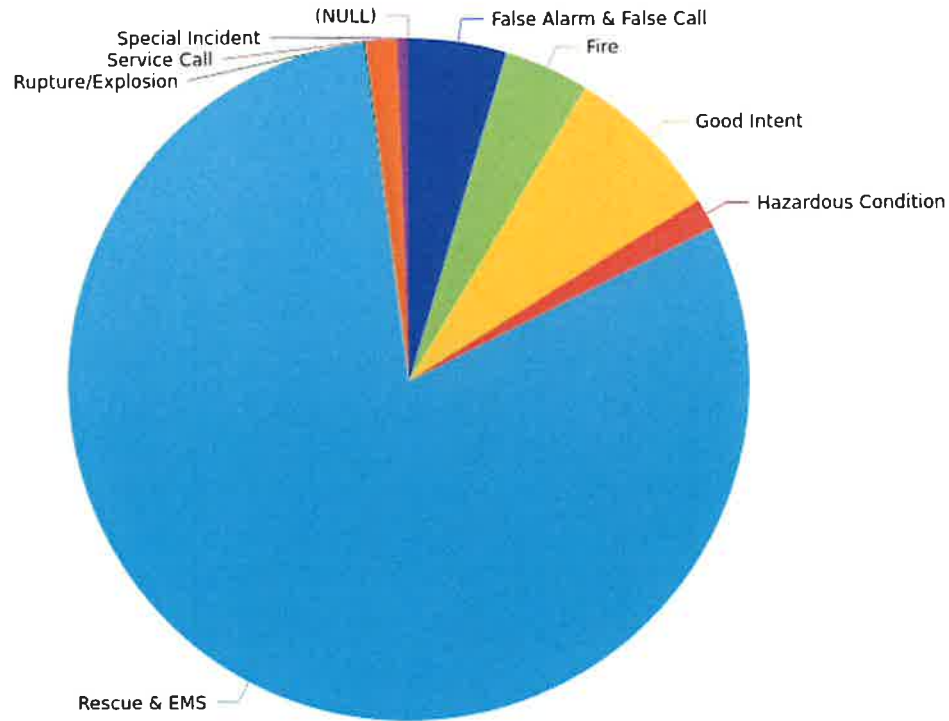

Sexual Assault Investigation Results in an Arrest, Additional Victims Possible.

On 04 November 2024, the Covington Police Department received a complaint regarding a sexual assault which occurred in the city limits of Covington. Detectives began the extensive investigation into the complaint which revealed multiple potential victims across Tipton County of females between the ages of 12 to 15. During the investigation the victims identified the suspect from his social media nickname as **"Bando"** and other variations such as "BXNDO", etc. On 07 March 2025, CPD Detectives and Analyst executed an arrest warrant for "Bando" at 1150 Simonton Street in Covington, TN. Officers confirmed his identity as **Ja'Marreous McKinnis, 20, of Covington, Tennessee**. Officers confirmed McKinnis was on out-of-State probation for an alleged weapon charge.

McKinnis was transported to the Covington Police Department Criminal Investigation Division for questioning and admitted to his role during the investigation. He was transported to the Tipton County Jail and formally charged with Rape of A Child. McKinnis remains in custody to appear before **Tipton County General Sessions Court Judge M.O. Eckel, III** on 11 March 2025. The investigation is still ongoing and additional charges are expected.

"I commend the great police work by the detectives and analysts who gathered the social media intel which revealed the true identity of the suspect in this case. Detectives are currently working with several other local jurisdictions to vet the information and possibly identify additional victims." said Chief Donna Turner "During the investigation, Detectives worked jointly with the Department of Children Services and the Carl Perkins Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse which provided services for the victims and their families. We ask if parents will talk to their children and please contact CID if they have had any correspondences with "Bando".

Covington Police Make Arrest in Weekend Stabbing

On 07 March 2025, the Covington Police Department responded to a stabbing complaint at 1995 Highway 51 (Baptist Tipton Hospital) in Covington, TN. CPD Officers spoke to the stabbing victim who stated that when he was leaving the **Ruff Ryders Club located at 113 East St**, he was stabbed by another patron at the venue. Due to the severity of the injuries suffered by the victim, he was later airlifted to Regional One for further treatment. Detectives from the Criminal Investigation Division (CID) responded to begin processing the crime scene. According to the victim, there was a verbal argument with the suspect inside the Club resulting in the suspect allegedly cutting him with a razor blade.

During the course of the investigation, Detectives developed a suspect in the case identified as **Leslie Adams, 61, of the 200 block of Loon Lane in Covington, Tennessee**. CPD Officers were able to locate Adams and transport him to the CID for questioning. Adams admitted to his role in the stabbing. Adams was formally charged with **Aggravated Assault with Injuries** and transported to the Tipton County Jail where he is being held for his arraignment by the Tipton County Magistrate. Adams is slated to appear before General Sessions Court Judge M.O. Eckel, III on 11 March 2025.

"Due to the good police work by the Patrol Officers and Detectives at the scene, the suspect was quickly identified and located." said Chief Donna Turner "As the Spring temperatures begin to rise, we are increasing our patrols at these establishments to aid in reducing violence. This will increase the safety of other patrons throughout the Summer."

Operation "HIGH STAKES" Yields Vape Seizures

On 11 March 2025 the Covington Police Department Criminal Investigation Division (CID) concluded an investigation into local retailers selling "Hemp Derived Cannabinoid" (HDC) products. This investigative operation was the result of multiple complaints from individuals who have used the products sold at these types of stores which were purchased in Covington and suffered significant negative medical effects. We began verifying licenses which are filed through the State of Tennessee Department of Agriculture which regulates and oversees this industry in conjunction with the Department of Revenue. The records indicate that Covington has eight (8) licensed stand-alone businesses and six (6) pending license approvals to sell these products. All of the current locations are on Highway 51 in the city limits of Covington. These numbers do not include convenience stores which are also approved to sell the products.

The operation was at eleven (11) locations in the City of Covington who are selling Hemp Derived Cannabinoid products which include vapes, edibles, and similar products. During the operation, seven (7) locations successfully checked identification to assure the customer was 21 years-of-age and refused to sell to a minor without proper identification. These locations include:

B.D. Tobacco and Vape Shop - 102 U.S. Hwy 51 South
C-Town Market Express - 526 Highway 51 North
Hwy 51 Exxon #2 - 955 Highway 51 North
Tobacco Junction - 105 #A Mueller Brass Road
Vape and More - 1603 Highway 51 North
Midway IV - 415 U.S. Highway 51 South
Fastimes #4 - 101 Highway 51 South

During operation "High Stakes" four (4) of the locations which sell the HDC products did not check identification and sold a HDC electronic vaporizer to a minor. Those locations were:

TKR Novelty and Accessories - 887 Highway 51 North
US51 Tobacco Vape Shop LLC aka Smokey Bear - 535 Highway 51 North
Exotic Stoners - Suite E, 1655 Highway 51 South
Fastway - 880 Highway 51 North

The clerks that did not check for identification at the locations were cited into Tipton County General Sessions Court for **Sale of An Electronic Vaporizer containing THC to a Minor.**

During the operation a search warrant was executed at **Exotic Stoners located at 1655 Suite E Highway 51 South** due to the high Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) content from a product previously purchased. The products field tested at 74% Delta-9 THC despite the label indicating 0.3% Delta-9. The current Tennessee law allows products with 0.3% or less to be sold legally to adults over the age of twenty-one (21). CID Detectives are working closely with the 25th Judicial District Attorney's Office staff to determine additional charges on products containing Delta-9 which exceed the legal limits.

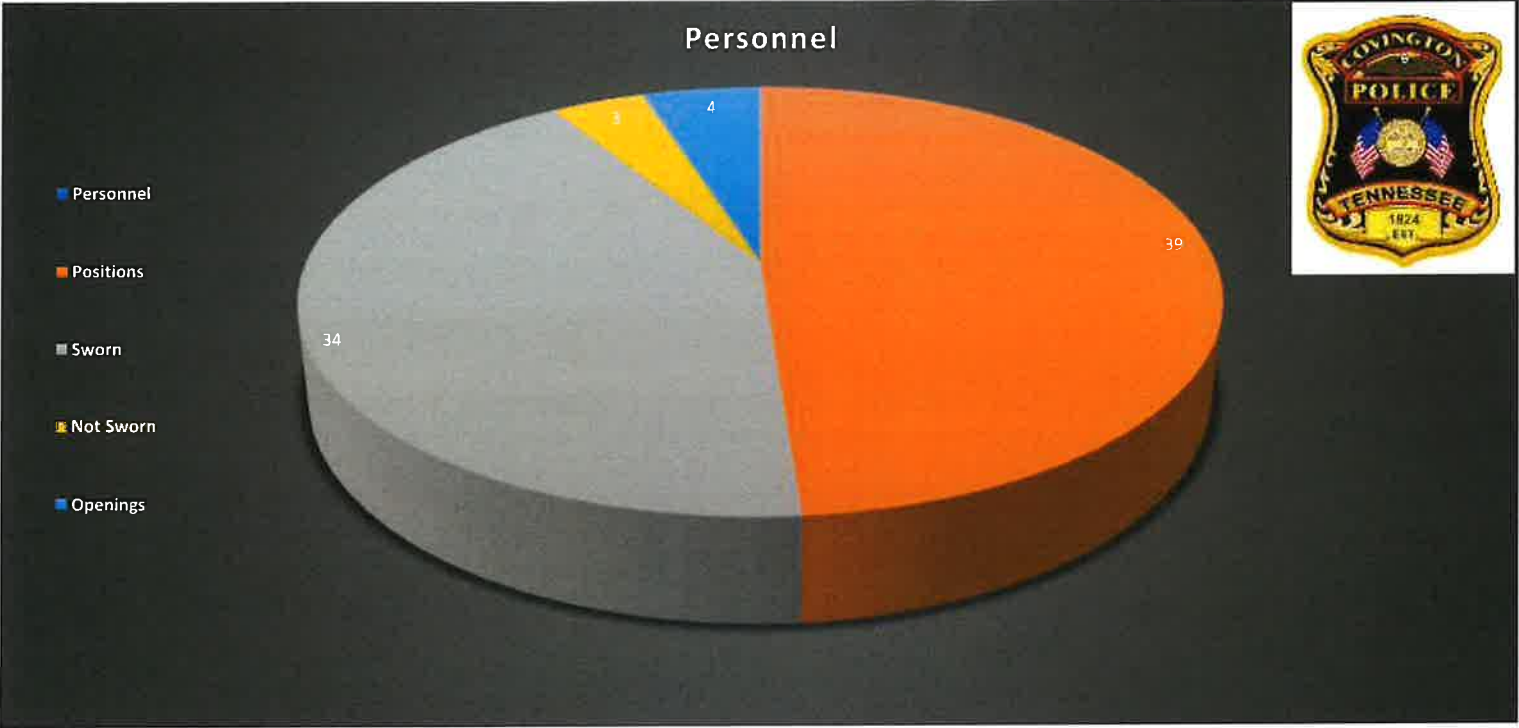
CPD Detectives and Intel Analysts, at the scene were assisted by TBI Dangerous Drug Task Force Agents and conducted drug analysis on multiple products. These tests confirmed that 180 products including 46 pre-rolled joints, 108 vaporizers (vapes), and 26 cartridge refills tested over the legal limit at 60 to 70% Delta-9. The products were seized during the raid and collected as evidence.

"This is a wakeup call for adults and parents whose children may be purchasing these products. Our investigation confirmed that the packaging misrepresents the content of Delta-9 and THC derivatives in these products. Currently there are no regulations being enforced for this industry, which is solely a function of state agencies. Bottom line, we don't know what are in these products. The psychoactive element of these products is Delta-9 which may negatively affect children's health and overall behavior." said Chief Donna Turner "I urge parents to speak to your children on their use of these and similar products which the packaging and the advertisement appear to be directed towards children. If you suspect your child may be using these products, please talk to them and seek immediate involvement. We are jointly working with Tipton Prevents to have educational sessions for our students, parents, and school staff of Tipton County starting in April."
