Overnight, we had multiple flooded roadways and 2 water rescues (one on Simonton and Town Creek, one on West Liberty and HWY 51).

On West Liberty, two people were stranded in their vehicle in swift moving waters. The **Covington, TN Fire Department** and CPD Officers safely escorted them to safety. On Simonton and Town Creek, 2 adults who were walking in the area lost their footing and were swept away into swift moving waters in the ditch along the roadway. After being submerged under a culvert, one adult recovered from the waters. The second victim was found approximately 25 feet further down the ditch entangled in debris. Two CPD Officers entered the waters and pulled the victim safely to the street. Officers began CPR and were assisted by Covington Fire Department, EMS personnel, and EMA Director Baker McCool at the scene. He was transported by ambulance to Baptist Tipton Hospital and later transferred to Baptist East in Memphis where he remains in a critical condition.

"Our thoughts and prayers continue to be with the victim and the victim's family along with the West Tennessee regional victims and their families who suffered damage and death throughout the night." said Chief Donna Turner

As we continue to be weather aware today with the possibility of severe weather and flooding, we want to continue to caution people to Turn Around Don't Drown in waters covering the roadways.

On April 2, 2025, on Simonton and Town Creek, 2 adults who were walking in the area lost their footing and were swept away into swift moving waters in the ditch along the roadway. After being submerged under a culvert, one adult was recovered from the waters. The second victim was found approximately 25 feet further down the ditch entangled in debris.

Two CPD Officers entered the waters and pulled the victim safely to the street. Officers began CPR and were assisted by Covington Fire Department, EMS personnel, and EMA Director Baker McCool at the scene. He was transported by ambulance to Baptist Tipton Hospital and later transferred to Baptist East in Memphis.

On Friday, April 4, 2025, at around noon, victim Bobby Burnett, 74, of Covington, TN succumbed to his injuries related to drowning.

"Our thoughts and prayers continue to be with the victim and the victim's family regarding this death due to the recent storms." said Chief Donna Turner. "I commend the two officers that risked their own safety to jump into the swift waters to rescue Mr. Burnett. This is one example of the dangers all our first responders; police, fire, EMS, and rescue face every day. We are proud of our first responders and mourn the loss of a devoted father in our Covington Community."

CPD investigation confirms bomb threat false at Covington High School.

At approximately 8am today, the Covington Police Department responded to a potential bomb threat at Covington High School.

School Resource Officers at CHS confirmed the caller called on a landline to the front office and made threatening allegations. The voice of the caller was an older male of middle eastern descent from a phone originated from South Carolina. School staff immediately began evacuating the school out of an abundance of safety for the students and staff. Superintendent Dr John Combs responded to the campus along with Troopers from the Tennessee Highway Patrol to assist in the incident.

CPD officers began searching the facility and was assisted by a bomb detection K9 team activated by the Tipton County Schools of Tennessee . No devices or suspicious packages were located during the search.

Detectives and Agents from TN Homeland Security responded to assist in the investigation. Detectives determined the caller mimicked being an artificial intelligence generated voice. The owner of the number was immediately identified from South Carolina. Tipton County E911 Central dispatch assisted in determining a location for the number which reflected the South Carolina address. A follow up call to the local South Carolina law enforcement agency resulted in officers contacting the owner of the phone in South Carolina. Both agencies verified the threat as false. Students were released and returned to the school.

"We are thankful the threat was false. I commend all the quick responses of staff, officers, agents, troopers and detectives. The execution of the emergency response plan and procedures for our schools resulted in the threat being eliminated quickly to restore the daily activities at CHS." said Chief Donna Turner "The safety of our schools remains a priority in the City of Covington."

Covington Police Department Investigates Shooting Incident Resulting in Multiple Arrests

On 12 April 2025 at approximately 4:00 AM, officers with the Covington Police Department, with the assistance of deputies from the Tipton County Sheriff's Office, responded to reports of shots fired at **Broadmeadows Apartment Complex, located at 150 Peeler Road in Covington, TN**. Upon arrival, officers discovered a vehicle that had been damaged by gunfire and encountered a large group of individuals gathering in the vicinity. Several individuals were detained and interviewed on the scene. Officers established that no one had been injured related to the shots being fired but did confirm property damage to a vehicle. Detectives from the CPD Criminal Investigation Division responded to process the crime scene. Detectives utilized license plate readers in the area and surveillance cameras at the apartments to confirm the individuals and vehicles involved in the incident.

During the course of the investigation, detectives determined that a black Nissan Altima was involved in the incident. Surveillance footage revealed that the driver of the Altima discharged a firearm towards the area of the damaged vehicle during an altercation with an unidentified male who was dressed in all black. Officers and Deputies saturated the Complex and identified **David Jones**, **Jr**, **25 and James Pearson**, **30**, **both of Covington** attempting to leave the scene in a black 2014 Chevrolet Cruze. Officers confirmed the duo had been involved in an argument at the apartments just prior to the shots being fired. Officers recovered 36.1 grams of marijuana in their vehicle, and both were charged with Possession of Schedule VI with Intent to Deliver. The narcotics were collected and the vehicle was seized and transported to the CPD seizure lot.

In addition, while Officers were responding to the shots fired incident, they encountered **Lawrence Brent, 32, of Covington** walking in the area of the shooting scene. Officers observed Brent to be unsteady on his feet and appeared to be intoxicated. Brent was arrested for Public Intoxication and transported to the Tipton County Jail.

The suspect vehicle was later identified as a 2013 black Nissan Altima, which was occupied by **Eric McGee Jr.**, **29**, **of Covington**. McGee was located and interviewed, during which he admitted to his role in the shooting incident. McGee confirmed he hid in the area to allegedly avoid officers conducting the investigation at the Apartments and later disposing of the firearm in the Hatchie River,

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Detectives formally charged **Eric McGee Jr.** with Reckless Endangerment, Vandalism, and Tampering with Evidence. McGee is free on a \$50,000.00 bond awaiting his appearance in Tipton County General Session Court this week before Judge M.O. Eckel, III. In addition, **David Jones, Jr, James Pearson, and Lawrence Brent** are free on bond awaiting their appearance in Tipton County General Sessions Court later this month.

"I am thankful for the partnership with the Tipton County Sheriff's Office and for their collaboration during this investigation. It was a challenge with the number of people in the area, but the officers and deputies quickly identified those involved and took immediate actions to return safety for the residents." said Chief Donna Turner "As the summer begins, we will be continuing to increase our patrol efforts in high traffic areas. The residents assisted in this investigation by confirming those individuals who were causing the disturbance in the complex. I am thankful for the cooperation which aided officers and detectives in holding those responsible for the incident."

Nashville Courthouse Crisis Averted; Swift Arrest Made by Covington Police

On 11 April 2025, the Covington Police Department Criminal Investigation Division received information from Nashville Metro Police Department Detectives concerning an investigation of terroristic threats. According to Nashville Metro Police, a subject later identified as **Aireiz Macklin, 32**, of **Covington, Tennessee** was making threats to harm the Davidson County Criminal Court Clerk and damage the Davidson County Courthouse. CPD Detectives worked jointly with the Detectives from Nashville.

On 17 April 2025, Covington Police Department Patrol Officers were able to locate and arrest Macklin in the 1800 block of South College. Macklin was arrested without incident and is currently being held in the Tipton County Jail, awaiting extradition to Nashville. Macklin is being charged with two (2) active warrants from Davidson County, Violation of An Order of Protection and Theft of Services under \$1,000.00. Detectives expect additional charges due to the threat investigation.

"If you choose to make these type of threats, we will respond swiftly." said Chief Donna Turner "We will continue to support the efforts of the Nashville Metro Police Department Detectives and assist them in our jurisdiction during their investigation."

In addition, we are looking for a vehicle with signifiant damage to the front portion of the vehicle. Our thoughts and prayers continue for Mr. Terry and his recovery."
